This is the Last Will and Testament of

the District of Columbia in the Province of
Virginia Indigo Planter,

First The two Houses that I have in Calcutta having
been made over in trust for the benefit of my
Wife Sarah Poulson and from and after the
death of my said Wife to my Nephew Henry
Augustus Poulson The Papers of the said
Houses are in the hands of R. H. Allan as he
is one of the Trustees,

Secondly I give and bequeath to my said Nephew
Henry Augustus Poulson the half share that
I have in the Portland Indigo Works which
he can sell or do as he thinks proper with
but he must assist his Sister Mrs. Hoovey
as long as she is remaining a Widow with one
third of the Amount she may sell for
such dividends as may be paid from the Estate
of the late Firm of Messrs. Alexander & Co.
my Executors will receive and invest the same
in Companies Papers, the interest to be paid
to my said Wife Sarah Poulson for the term
of her natural life and after her death the
principal to be equally divided between
Henry Augustus Poulson John Poulson and
Sachina Hoovey or such of the three that
may be living at the time,

Thirdly The Bond which I have from my Brother
John Poulson is not to be put in force either

 hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourteenth
 day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand
 Eight hundred and thirty three.
