This is the Last Will and Testament of me John Marsh Earle of 33 Addison Gardens West Kensington Park London Lieutenant General retired I appoint as my sole Executor my brother Edward Lempriere Earle of Rape Isle of Wight Colonel retired I direct my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses to be paid I give to Mrs Alice Demidukke my housekeeper Wife of Basil Demidukke the sum of five hundred Pounds free of legacy duty I give to Laura Eliza Portnell of Bridge House Bournemouth Llyswen in the County of Radnor in Wales Spinster formerly in my service as housemaid the sum of three hundred pounds free of legacy duty and as to all the rest and residue of my Estate I desire that it be divided into four equal shares and as to one such share I give the same to my brother the said Colonel Edward Lempriere Earle as to another such share I give the same to my sister Mrs Emily Jane Comper of No. 1 Portchester Square London widow and as to another such share I give the same to my sister Mrs Marian Lucy Chanter of 208 Avenue Road Heter in the County of Middlesex Widow and as to the remaining one fourth share I give the same unto and equally between Henry George Impey Siddons and Harriett Sophia Siddons the surviving children of my deceased sister Susan Mary Siddons both of whom are now residing at 2 Woodhill Place Bath in the County of Somerset or the survivor of them if only one shall be living at the time of my decease. And in the event of any of the said shares dying leaving issue living at my decease I direct that such issue shall take the share which their deceased parent would if living have taken. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this first day of June one thousand nine hundred and eight.
