My dear Ernest

By this mail I received
your kind letter about the
Jacu I can't tell you how obliged
I am for the trouble you & dear
Selvan have taken for me. I
have written to Selvan to say if you
should make any more to send
you the money for it at once.

My coming home was a very
sudden thing, but I am glad
I came on, as the change has al-
ready done me so much good. I
really thought I would have died
several times on board ship. From

dreadful sickness on my head
the whole voyage I was quite
prostrated with it. People were
all very kind to me, & the voyage
would have been quite enjoyable
for it was so calm all the way
had I been feeling well, but as
it was I was perfectly miserable.
My youngest daughter is with
me for a little while & is such
a comfort.

I came home really & excited
my eye operation at the coming
Colonial & Indian exhibition. I
went down to day to the Crystal
Palace to have my piece of ground
allotted to me. The exhibition opens
on the 12th of next month. I fear
I shall not be able to get it ready
in time, but must do the best I

can. with kind love to your
