My dear Ernest

No doubt you will be very surprised to get these few lines from me from England. I left Simla so suddenly on the 1st April 1905 - owing to having been so ill. & now I am going back again please God in the Sardine. one of the P. & O. Steamers going to Calcutta. I believe she is due there on the 7th of Nov. could you & Sylvia put me up for a few hours, as I would like to leave the same evening for Simla, where I am urgently required. if you can do so let some of your servants, come to meet me & direct me to your house I would also ask you kindly to find

out if Mr. Ch. that man who owes me 45 Rupees is in Calcutta. if he is I would make a point of going to see him, as also please find out if the National Bank is still in existence. I would like to pay these a call & find out a Miss Leonard's address, she owes me 750 Rs for board & lodging. after the fruit of next year it will part limitation.

Do you think you could do all this to oblige me.

I am much better, but feel a good deal aged all the same. The worries of life have been great. & not so easily born at my age.

Give my love to Sylvia & your mother whose acquaintance I shall hope to make very soon.

Of course if any thing happens

to prevent my coming by that steamer I will write & let you know, by a previous mail

I am not quite sure of your number in Eldest Road. so I have marked 33 with a query.
