

Letter from Sylvie Escat Saunders (Mrs. G.A. Saunders)  
to a Davis family descendant, February 2, 1918

]

Sylvie Escat Saunders (1883-1963) was the wife of George Allen Saunders, a grandson of Thomas Bailey Saunders. She became very interested in her husband's genealogy after her marriage with her starting point being the letter Thomas Bailey Saunders had written in the 1890s to his nephew Elkanah Shuford Saunders of North Carolina. Sylvie spent many years contacting other Saunders descendants from North Carolina to Texas, hoping to piece together the remaining scattered fragments of family tradition.

Among the people with whom Sylvie corresponded were the following:

Alfred Head Mashburn Sanders of Jackson County, Alabama, a son of Benjamin, grandson of Isaac Saunders. "Uncle Mash," as he was called, couldn't read or write, so he must have dictated the return letter to someone else who did the actual writing.

John Duff Sanders of Morton, Texas, son of Harris Sanders, son of Nimrod Saunders, son of William Aaron Saunders.

Elkanah Shuford Saunders of Cumberland County, North Carolina, a son of Henry, son of Jacob, son of Isaac Saunders.

Nathaniel Powell Sanders of Jackson County, Alabama, a son of Benjamin, son of John G., son of Joseph Sanders who married Deborah, daughter of Jacob Saunders, son of Isaac Saunders.

Phebe Emaline Sanders Kingery of Alhambra, Illinois, a daughter of Deborah, daughter of Jacob Saunders, son of Isaac.

The following letter summarizing her research was written in 1918 by Sylvie Saunders and sent to a Davis descendant of Tabitha Sanders, the daughter of Nimrod Saunders, son of William Aaron Saunders. Years later the letter was found in the Davis Family Bible, where it had probably been placed by the original recipient of the letter. Jerry Wynn, a Davis descendant, distributed the letter to other researchers, and Don Schaefer, editor of *Sanders Siftings*, sent me a photocopy which I have converted to a PDF in order to provide an online facsimile of the original. Notice that although Sylvie Saunders' penmanship is excellent, she rarely uses punctuation, causing some difficulty in interpreting exactly what she means to say.
