Dinah Might was the Petty crew's normal aircraft, but it did not pass pre-flight inspection on Petty's last mission and the crew was assigned Slick Chick. B24bestweb currently [11/27/2020] shows Dinah Might as

- 1. Source for indicated nose art photos: Pictorial Highlights from the History of the 460th Bombardment Group (H), Edward J. Devney, 1946 provides a collage of various 460th nose art photos.
- 2. 460th Bomb Group History, Duane L. and Betty J. Bohnstedt, Taylor Publishing Co., Dallas, TX, 1996.
- 3. Aircraft serial no. 44-49392, shown as Rough Rider of the 460th Bomb Group, appears on the aircraft roster of the 454th BG/ 737th BS as Sub-Depot Susy. Pictures of both Rough Rider and Sub-Depot Susy are on file. One list has same aircraft serial number with the 465th BG/780th BS. The American Air Museum in Britain website shows the picture of Sub-Depot Susy as 44-42392 not 44-49392. 460th BG's Rough Rider nose art was painted by Duane "Sparky" Bohnstedt.
- 4. A photo of "The Character" appears in Bohnstedt's 460th Bomb Group History, p. 126. No serial number is provided in the caption. This aircraft is shown with the 485th BG as 42-52727 on B24bestweb.com. Bohnstedt's aircraft inventory list does not include this serial number. It is unknown of the aircraft was transferred to the 485th BG at some point or actually spent time with the 460th BG. Photos of "The Character" with the 485th BG appear to be after many combat missions as evidenced by its painted mission markings. I do not include it in the 460th BG aircraft inventory at this point.
- 5. Hula Honey was once incorrectly thought to be the aircraft TRF to 485th BG/831st BS as Vee Dee II, Letter J. B244bestweb volunteers indicate that is not the case. Vee Dee is known to be 42-51276 and does not match the physical characteristics of Hula Honey. Facebook's 460th BG group member Flip Marchese cites John Robert "Bob" Beitling, WWII aircraft historian and author, as listing 42-51325 as a 460th BG aircraft transferred to the 485th BG/831st BS, RTN USA 6/15/1945, RFC Altus. 42-51325 is a strong candidate for Hula Honey.
- 6. Photos of Corsica Kid (42-78269, 459th BG/759th BS) and Lady X (possibly 459th BG) appear in Bohnstedt's 460th Bomb Group History with 460th airmen posing in the photo, but there is no definite evidence these two aircraft were actually 460th Bomb Group aircraft. It is possible the two aircraft photos were included in Bohnstedt's 460th history book simply because 460th airmen were posing with the two aircraft.
- 7. Bohnstedt² shows 42-52385, Straight Shot, as 760th BS letter H and then transferred to the 763rd BS as letter G. He notes Lt. Ben Haller as Pilot. Haller was with the 761st BS.
- 8. A photo is on file for B-24 J-CF 42-64380, an unnamed aircraft with Bulldog nose art. Seen on page 182 of Bohnstedt's history book. B-24 J15-CF, serial no. 42-64380. This is the aircraft CO Robert T. Crowder was piloting when shot down and killed on

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- 4/15/1944. MACR 4099. The nose art is the emblem of the 354th Fighter Group, 355th Fighter Squadron, known as the Pugnacious Pups, and appeared in Oldsmobile ads during the war years. Oldsmobile manufactured the cannons used on the fighters.
- 9. BS is per Findagrave memorials for 763rd BS crew members who died in the 4/271945 crash Harold J. Snyder, Lionel J. Emswiler, and Morton A. Rosenbloom. Another source, Henrick B. Hansen, 761st BS, indicates he wrote a poem included in the 460th Bomb Group History (page 30) while on the 8/12/1944 mission at the Southern Belle's radio operator's table.
- 10. A crew photo owned by Edward C. Brooks, a bombardier with the 460th BG 761st BS labeled "Straight Shot B-24 Crew 761st Sq 460th BG 15th AAF Italy" is on file.
- 11. This listing previously included 42-95295 as "Pappy's Pride". Current belief is that although 42-95295 was a 460th BG 761st BS aircraft it was not named "Pappy's Pride". An aircraft by that name belonged to the 464th BG. It is possible that 42-95295 could be named "Silver Satan". 42-95295 as "Pappy's Pride" come from Flip Marchese's list which is based on John R. "Bob" Beitling data.
