Company, (2d.) 23rd Regiment of Iowa Infantry  
 VOLUNTEERS, who was enrolled on the Eleventh day of August  
one thousand eight hundred and Sixty two to serve Three years or  
 during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States  
 this twenty sixth day of July, 1865, at Harrisburg Texas  
 in accordance with by reason of General order 44 M.D.M.C.S. & General order 34 war Dept. A.G.O.  
 (No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)

Said Thomas A. Harding was born in Franklin County  
 in the State of Indiana, is Eighteen years of age,  
five feet ten & half inches high, Fair complexion, Grey eyes,  
Brown hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Mail carrier  
 Given at Harrisburg Texas this twenty sixth day of  
July 1865.

This sentence will be erased should there be anything in the conduct or physical condition of the soldier rendering him unfit for the Army.
