

named him Thomas. The baby was but a few days old when Jessie was again walking along with the other women of the company. They arrived at Salt Lake City on September 10, 1861, and camped about three miles south of the city, so their cattle could have food, being very thin from the long journey.

Here they met a man whose name was George Woods, who said he was located at Wellsville, Utah. After talking with him for a while he asked where they were going. They didn't know, but they had relatives somewhere in Utah. After telling him their names (James Archibald and John Hendry) he said he knew them and that they too were located in Wellsville. They decided they would go to this place. On the night of fifth day, they were on the hill overlooking Wellsville and they decided for sure to stay because of the beauty of the valley. This was the 15<sup>th</sup> of September 1861. At this time most were still living in and around the Maughan's Fort, but as early as 1861 the land was being apportioned and given out. Houses were beginning to appear outside of the fort.

Living in a fort for four (3 I think) ( years, the house of Robert Murray and David Kerr were side by side, each having about 24 feet of ground to grow a garden. On
