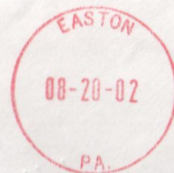

KNOW all Men by these Presents, That we *Mary Bittew* widow and *Relict of Arnold Bittew* late of Lower Mount Bethel township, Mason Deced and *Henry Weaver* and *Andrew Hey*, both of the same place Women in the County of Northampton in Pennsylvania

are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the Sum of *Three hundred* Pounds to be paid to the said Commonwealth: To the which Payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, jointly and severally, for and in the default of us, our heirs and assigns, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *thirty*

THE Condition of this Obligation is such, That if the above bounden *Mary Bittew*

Administratrix of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of *Arnold Bittew* deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to the Hands, Possession or Knowledge of *her* the said *Mary*

Administratrix as aforesaid, or unto the Hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for *her* and the same so made do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, to the Court of the said Northampton County or before the

Mary Administratrix as aforesaid, or unto the Hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for *her* do well and truly administer according to Law. And further do make, or cause to be made, a true and just Account of *her* said Administration, at or before the *26th* Day of *May* 1804 And all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattels and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administration Account (the same being first examined and allowed of by the Orphans' Court of the County of Northampton) shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively, the said Orphans' Court by their Decree or Sentence, pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of the several Laws now in force in this Commonwealth, shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said Deceased, and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said Register's Office, making Request to have it allowed and approved accordingly: And if then the above bounden *Mary Bittew*

Administratrix as aforesaid, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration (Approval of such Testament being first had and made in the said Register's Office) then this Obligation to be void and of none Effect, or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.

and that she will well and truly administer all and every the goods of the said deceased, and pay his debts as
far as his goods will extend, and that she will exhibit a true, full and perfect inventory of the goods of the
said deceased, and render a true account of his administration into the Register's Office, when he shall be thereunto
lawfully required: And also, that she is the widow
of the said Arnold Bitter,
deceased, and that the whole of the goods, chattels and credits he died possessed of, do not in value exceed the sum of
Three hundred pounds.
