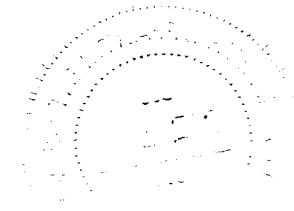

That if said Mrs. Mund still has said note this administrator may be able to get a copy thereof, if given time so to do.

EXHIBIT J.

As to objection 19:-

The \$12.40 was for insurance on the buildings on the Ludwig farm. The insurance was contracted by Ferdinand Ludwig during his lifetime. Ferdinand Ludwig died in November 1908 and the premium of \$12.40 came due and payable in May 1909 and was paid May 29, 1909 by Richard Ludwig as reported.

EXHIBIT K.

As to objection 20:-

Richard Ludwig kept no itemized statement of his services in the management and settling up of the estate. That a great amount of his time was expended in such management and settlement, and on the final settlement with the other heirs it was agreed among them that he should retain for such services said sum of \$25.00. The heirs, other than Richard, fixed this sum as a reasonable one for his services and he accepted same under that arrangement. This was to be in addition to any service rendered in connection with the public sale and hauling personal property to market.

EXHIBIT L.

As to objection 22:-

The only firewood disposed of by Richard Ludwig was a pile of old poles which was sold to Ora Keller and others for the sum of ten dollars. That this sum was all said poles were worth and was all he received for same, and he charges himself therewith in his report.

He therefore, asks that his said report be approved by this court, and his prayer therein granted.

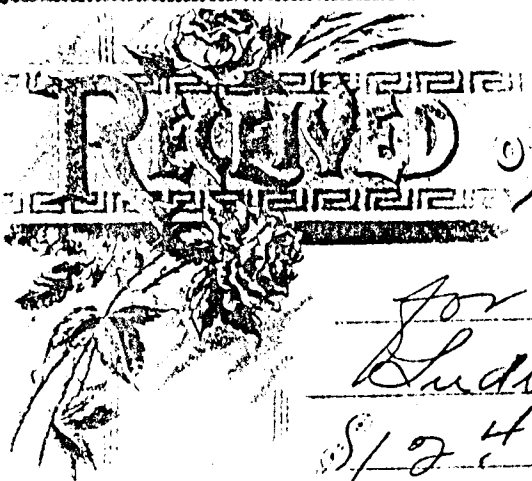
