The Supreme Executive Council of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting: Know ye, that in consideration of the monies paid by Jonathan Stephens to the late Proprietaries at the granting of the Warrant hereinafter mentioned of the sum of seventy eight pounds ten shillings lawful Money now paid by him into the said office of the receiver General of this Commonwealth

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said Jonathan Stephens a certain tract of Land called "Warwick" situate in Robinson Township in the County of Berks Beginning at a post a corner of Land late of James Swaffer thence by land late of John Suby North eighty degrees West Twenty four perches to a post a corner of vacant Land thence by the same West one hundred and twenty six perches to a Chestnut Oak North fifty six perches to a Black Oak West forty two perches to a post North one hundred and three perches to a White Oak & East one hundred and twenty five perches to a stone in a line of the said James Swaffer's land thence by the same South twenty one degrees East one hundred and eighty four perches,

to the place of beginning, containing one hundred and eighty one acres and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. with the appurtenances [which said tract was surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to the said Jonathan Stephens dated the 26th September 1748 which deed dated 18th November 1750 conveyed the same to the said David Jones wholly deeded dated 6th Decr 1750 conveyed the same to John Morris who by deed dated the 23rd November 1762 conveyed the same to the said Jonathan Stephens in fee.]
To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances unto the said Jonathan Stephens and his heirs, to the use of him the said Jonathan Stephens

his heirs and assigns forever free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore, for the use of this commonwealth to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges.
