

Know all men by these presents, that Milo Hard of the County of Marshall and State of Indiana, in consideration of two hundred dollars to him paid by Adam Snyder of the County aforesaid, and State aforesaid the receipt whereof he does hereby acknowledge, doth by these presents, Give grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Adam Snyder his heirs and assigns certain parcels of Land, Situated in the County of Marshall and State of Indiana, and described as follows, viz: The North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Eighteen, and the South East quarter of the South East quarter of Section Seven in Township thirty four North of Range two East North Township Containing Eighty Acres, be the same more or less, together with all the privileges and appurtenances, to the said land in any appertaining and belonging, to have and to hold the above granted premises to the said Adam Snyder his heirs and assigns, to his and their use and enjoyment forever. And he the said Milo Hard for himself, his heirs executors and administrators does covenant with the said Adam Snyder his heirs and assigns that he is lawfully seized in fee of the aforesaid premises; that they are free from all incumbrances; that he has good right to sell and convey the same to the said Adam Snyder as aforesaid; And that he will and his heirs executors and administrators shall Warrant and defend the same to the said Adam Snyder his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful demands of all persons. And Cornelia S. Hard wife of the said Milo Hard in consideration of ten cents to her paid the receipt whereof she does hereby acknowledge, does hereby release to the said Adam Snyder his heirs and assigns all her right and title of power in the aforesaid premises.
