[6] Sixthly. I give and devise and bequeath unto my grandson Thos. C. Carrico son of James Carrico my son a certain tract or parcel of Land (very good being in the County of Rawlson State of Missouri and described as follows the remainder of a six hundred arpents of Land which I have not sold which I bought of Armont Desousies being a part of ten thousand arpents of Land granted by the Spanish government and commonly called Fremont's tract. said balance or remainder containing one hundred and fifty acres of Land more or less and I hereby constitute and appoint my son James Carrico my agent to look after and attend to said land and generally to do and act in the premises in as full and ample manner as I myself could do.

[7] Seventhly. I have heretofore given and paid over unto my son Thos. C. Carrico all that I intended he should possess of my estate.

[8] Eighthly. I have heretofore given and paid over unto my son Dennis C. Carrico all that I intended he should possess of my estate.

[9] Ninthly. I give and bequeath and devise unto my daughter Elizabeth White wife of Jesse White the sum of fifty dollars to be paid unto her by my executor one year after my decease.

[10] Tenthly. I have heretofore given and paid over unto my son Thomas C. Carrico all that I intended he should possess of my estate.

[11] Eleventhly. I give, devise and bequeath unto the heirs or legal representatives of my daughter Margaret C. Carrico deceased the sum of fifty dollars to be divided equally between them and to be paid to them by my executor as soon as they severally become of lawful age.
