within a reasonable time after my decease as in his judgment may be proper. I should sell and dispose of said lands on the best terms that can be obtained and apply the proceeds of such sales to the following purposes to wit that he pay to my daughters and the heirs or legal representatives of my deceased children. The money arising from such sales so fast as the same is received and so soon as they become of lawful age receiving however from this devise all lands specially bequeathed in any other part of this instrument to have and to hold unto him the John B. Carreco and his heirs and assigns forever

[14] I give devise and bequeath unto my son James Carreco the sum of two dollars to be paid unto him one year after my decease by my executor

[15] I hereby and lawfully constitute and appoint John B. Carreco of the County of Perry and State of Illinois to be the executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all former wills by me made and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 28th Dec 1851
