

Ahnentafel of Philip Hays

--- 1st Generation ---

1. PHILIP HAYS. Also known as **PHILIP HAYES.** He was born on 2 Jan 1748 at Simsbury, Connecticut. He married **MARY STORY** at Westfield, Hampden Co., Massachusetts, on 26 Nov 1772. *George Hayes of Windsor and His Descendants* (1884) does not follow the descendants of Philip Hayes.

--- 2nd Generation ---

2. JONATHAN HAYES. Also known as **JONATHAN HAYS.** He was born on 15 Jun 1722 at Simsbury, Hartford Co., Connecticut. He married **MARY LOOMIS**, daughter of **PHILIP LOOMIS** and **HANNAH (___)**, at Simsbury, Hartford Co., Connecticut, on 8 May 1743. He was named in his father's will dated on 31 Oct 1765. *There may be additional children of Jonathan Hays and Mary Loomis. "George Hayes of Windsor and His Descendants" lists only the oldest four (Jonathan, Mary, Philip and Moses). Sarah was found in the Westfield, Mass. VRs as daughter of Jonathan Hays & Mary (there is no other Jonathan Hays living in the Westfield, Mass. - Simsbury, Ct. area at this time). There is a nine year gap between Moses (1750) and Sarah (1759). Although she would have been in her early 40s, Mary Loomis may have had other children.*

3. MARY² LOOMIS was born on 12 Apr 1713. She married **JONATHAN HAYES**, son of **GEORGE HAYES** and **A WIFE (NAME UNKNOWN)**, at Simsbury, Hartford Co., Connecticut, on 8 May 1743.

--- 3rd Generation ---

4. GEORGE³ HAYES was born on 9 Mar 1694/95 at Windsor, Connecticut. He married first before 1722 **A WIFE (NAME UNKNOWN)**. He married **SARAH HUXLEY** on 14 Dec 1739 (intention published at Suffield. Sarah Huxley of Suffield, George Hayes of Symsbury). His will was dated on 31 Oct 1765 (recorded at Simsbury). Devises his estate to Sarah his wife, sons Jonathan, George, Elisha, David, Benjamin, Jacob, Elijah and Amos, and only daughter Mary (Mercy), and to the heirs of daughters Zeruah Lamson and Jane Lamson.

5. A WIFE³ (NAME UNKNOWN) was probably born between 1695 and 1702. She married **GEORGE HAYES**, son of **GEORGE HAYES** and **ABIGAIL DIBBLE**, before 1722. She died before 1735.

6. PHILIP³ LOOMIS was born on 22 Feb 1675/76 at Westfield, Hampden Co., Massachusetts. He married **HANNAH (___)** circa 1704. He died on 1 Dec 1746 at Simsbury, Hartford Co., Connecticut.

7. HANNAH³ (___) was probably born between 1680 and 1690. She married **PHILIP LOOMIS**, son of **SAMUEL LOOMIS** and **ELIZABETH JUDD**, circa 1704.

--- 4th Generation ---

8. GEORGE⁴ HAYES was born circa 1655 (about age 70 when he wrote his will). "He came to Windsor, Connecticut from Scotland as early as 1680." He married first circa 1682 **SARAH (___)**. He married second at Windsor, Connecticut, on 29 Aug 1683 **ABIGAIL DIBBLE**, daughter of **SAMUEL DIBBLE**. His will was dated on 30 Apr 1725 proved 5 Oct 1725. "George Hayes Senor of Salmon Brook in the Town of Symsbury in the County of Hartford in the Colony of Connecticut in New England in America yeoman being about seventy years of age & weak in body but of sound and perfect mind & memory..." Names wife Abigail, son Daniel, daughter Abigail, son Benjamin, sons Daniel, George, William and Samuel, daughters Abigail, Sarah, Mary, Johanna, Thankful and Doritha. He died on 2 Sep 1725 at Simsbury, Connecticut.

9. **ABIGAIL⁴ DIBBLE** was born on 19 Jan 1666 at Windsor, Connecticut. She married **GEORGE HAYES** at Windsor, Connecticut, on 29 Aug 1683. She died after 1725.

12. **SAMUEL⁴ LOOMIS** was born in 1628 at Messing, Essex, England. He married **ELIZABETH JUDD**, daughter of **THOMAS JUDD** and **ELIZABETH (___)**, at Windsor, Hartford Co., Connecticut, on 27 Dec 1653. **SAMUEL LOOMIS** and **ELIZABETH JUDD** moved to at Westfield, Hampden Co., Massachusetts, where their children settled. He died in 1689.

13. **ELIZABETH⁴ JUDD** was born on 27 Dec 1635 at Farmington, Hartford Co., Connecticut. She married **SAMUEL LOOMIS**, son of **JOSEPH LOOMIS** and **MARY WHITE**, at Windsor, Hartford Co., Connecticut, on 27 Dec 1653. **ELIZABETH JUDD** and **SAMUEL LOOMIS** moved to at Westfield, Hampden Co., Massachusetts, where their children settled. She was living in 1716.

--- 5th Generation ---

18. **SAMUEL⁵ DIBBLE**

24. **JOSEPH⁵ LOOMIS** was born by before 1594. He married **MARY WHITE**, daughter of **ROBERT WHITE** and **BRIDGET ALLGAR**, at Shalford, Essex, England, on 30 Jun 1614. Joseph was a woolen-draper in Braintree, co. Essex, England. He came to New England aboard the ship *Susan and Ellen*, sailing 11 Apr 1638, and arriving at Boston, 17 Jul 1638. It is believed he remained at Dorchester, Massachusetts for about a year after his arrival. On 2 Feb 1640 he was granted 21 acres adjoining the Farmington River on the west side of the Connecticut River, part of the first English settlement made in Connecticut. He therefore probably came to Windsor in the summer or autumn of 1639, supposedly in the company of Rev. Ephraim Huet, who arrived in Windsor, 17 Aug 1639. He brought with him five sons, all of whom were Freeman, 7 Oct 1669, and three daughters. His house was located near the mouth of the Farmington river on "The Island," so called because at every freshet it became temporarily an island by the overflowing of the Connecticut River. He died on 25 Nov 1658 at Windsor, Hartford Co., Connecticut. He was buried at Windsor, Hartford Co., Connecticut.

25. **MARY⁵ WHITE** was baptized on 24 Aug 1590 at Shalford, Essex, England. She married **JOSEPH LOOMIS**, son of **JOHN LOOMIS** and **AGNES (___)**, at Shalford, Essex, England, on 30 Jun 1614. She died on 23 Aug 1652 at Windsor, Hartford Co., Connecticut.

26. **THOMAS⁵ JUDD** was born circa 1612 at England. He married **ELIZABETH (___)** at England circa 1630. Thomas Judd came from England in 1633 or 1634, and settled at Cambridge, Massachusetts. His four acre homelot was granted in August 1634, and was in that part of Cambridge called "West-End" on the north side of the highway to Watertown. He is listed among those who received a proportion of the meadow ground, 20 Aug 1635, and also in the list of those who had a house in Cambridge in Feb 1636. Thomas Judd was admitted a Freeman of the Colony on 25 May 1636. That same year he moved to Hartford, Connecticut, probably a part of the company that departed Cambridge on the last day of May in 1636, travelling through the wilderness to the Connecticut River. His homelot in Hartford contained about two acres, "abutting on the highway leading from William Gibben's to the ox pasture on the east, on James Cole's land on the south, on the highway leading from John Moody's towards Wethersfield on the west, and on Mr. Willy's land on the north." About 1644 Thomas moved again, this time to Farmington, Connecticut where he is counted among the first proprietors. His homelot there was the third lot from the north end of main street, on both sides of the street, and extended westward to Farmington River. He was sent as Deputy from Farmington to the General Court, first in May 1647, and then for many subsequent sessions, last serving that role in Oct 1679. In December 1679, Thomas Judd married the widow Clemence Mason, and resided with her at her home in Northampton, Massachusetts. Her homestead was on the east side of Pleasant Street, extending down to Hawley Street. She also owned forty acres of meadow. Thomas Judd was a member of Rev. Thomas Hooker's church, both at Cambridge and Hartford, and remained so until a church was formed at Farmington on 13 Oct 1652. He was one of the "seven pillars" of the church at Farmington, and served as its second Deacon. He is styled Deacon in the Connecticut records beginning in 1668, and the title followed him to Northampton. He married **CLEMENCE (___)** on 2 Dec 1679. He died on 12 Nov 1688 at Northampton, Hampshire Co., Massachusetts.

27. **ELIZABETH⁵ (___)** married **THOMAS JUDD** at England circa 1630. She died.

--- 6th Generation ---

48. **JOHN⁶ LOOMIS** was born before 1575 at England. He was a tailor, of Braintree, co. Essex, England. He married **AGNES (___)** at England before 1594. He died before 29 May 1619.

49. **AGNES**⁶ (____) married **JOHN LOOMIS** at England before 1594. She died after May 1619.

50. **ROBERT**⁶ **WHITE** was born before 1565. He married **BRIDGET ALLGAR**, daughter of **WILLIAM ALLGAR** and **A WIFE (NAME UNKNOWN)**, at Shalford, Essex, England, on 24 Jun 1585. Robert White, yeoman, lived in Shalford in Essex most of the time from 24 Jun 1585, the date of his marriage to Bridget Allgar, until a few months before his death. Robert's will names his wife Bridget, three sons Daniel, Nathaniel and John (the youngest), three married daughters Sarah, Mary, Elizabeth, and two unmarried daughters Bridget and Anna. It is believed that three daughters came to New England with their husbands: Mary, wife of Josiah Loomis of Braintree; Elizabeth, wife of William Goodwin of Bocking; Anna, wife of John Porter of Felsted. His will was dated on 27 May 1617. He was buried on 17 Jun 1617 at Messing, Essex, England.

51. **BRIDGET**⁶ **ALLGAR** was baptized on 11 Mar 1562 at Shalford, Essex, England. She married **ROBERT WHITE** at Shalford, Essex, England, on 24 Jun 1585.

--- 7th Generation ---

102. **WILLIAM**⁷ **ALLGAR** was born before 1540 at England. He married **A WIFE (NAME UNKNOWN)** before 1560. He was buried on 2 Aug 1575 at Shalford, Essex, England.

103. **A WIFE**⁷ **(NAME UNKNOWN)** married **WILLIAM ALLGAR** before 1560.
