hundred dollars; for payment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves,
and each and every of our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and
severally, firmly, by these presents.

Sealed with our seals and dated the eighteenth day of August, A.D.
One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty Six.

The condition of the above obligation is such, That if there be no lawful cause why
William Price and Mrs. Martha Bacchus
should not be joined together in the Matrimony, then this obligation
to be void: otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
