and each and every of our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and
severally, firmly by these presents.

Dated with our seals and dates this 4th day of January A. D.
One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Six.

The Condition of the above obligation is such, That if there be no lawful cause why
Lawrence Rolle and Matilda Bernier
should not be joined together in the Holy union of Matrimony, then this obligation
to be void: otherwise, to remain in full force and virtue.
