PARISH FORMATIONS

Charlotte County was one of the original 8 counties set up during the formation of the new province. At that time 7 parishes were set off, but they did not include all the lands assigned to the County.

ST. STEPHEN - set off nearly as is today, but for a period (1813-1873) it included lands that are now in other areas.

ST. DAVID - Nearly as at present

ST. ANDREWS - Nearly as at present, but included St. Croix

ST. PATRICK - Nearly as at present, but did not extend as far north. In 1814 it extended to the County line thus took in Dumbarton

ST. GEORGE - Extended only about half its northern depth until 1814

PENNFIELD - Included Lepreau, and assumed to extend north to County line in 1814

WEST ISLES - Included Campobello until 1803, Grand Manan until 1816, Moose, Frederick and Dudley Islands until they were transferred to the US in 1817

CAMPOBELLO - Set off in 1823 from West Isles, as at present

GRAND MANAN - Set off in 1823 from West Isles, as at present

ST. JAMES - Set off in 1823 from unassigned lands and part of St. Stephen

DUMBARTON - Set off in 1856 from St. Patrick

LEPREAU - Set off in 1859 from Pennfield

CLARENDON - Set off in 1869 from unassigned land (* or Pennfield and Lepreau)

DUFFERIN - Set off in 1873 from St. Stephen

ST. CROIX - Set off in 1874 from St. Andrews, altered slightly in 1896

(* see Clarendon - No legal justification was found to credit these lands to Pennfield although maps credit them to this Parish after 1814.)

MEMORIAL &c for LAND at PLEASANT RIDGE
(NICHOLAS JOHNSON & OTHERS 1807)

Sirs,

At the request of several respectable Settlers [herein?] I have taken the liberty of Inclosing to you a Memorial for a grant of land laying between the Settlements in this County and the Oromocto River ---

I hope the claims of the memorialist will appear to you, and that they may be honoured with your patronage, as the promise stated by them was made at the time, and never yet fulfilled ---

They are loyal Subjects who may be Depended upon. --- An establishment

where they propose Settling same, bids fair to [formate?] the Settling of the vacant lands in that quarter, which are available --- and very fit for Cultivation ---

The names Erased were persons not answering the Particular Description of Settlers in the Memorial ---

I will take care that the necessary fee is paid for lodging and recording the Memorial at the Secretary's Office.

Humbly Seweth.

That your Memorialist in general are of the number of those Loyalist, who emigrated into this country at the peace with America in 1783, or their sons now of age, and were mostly comprised among those Loyalist denominated the Penobscot Association, who settled in and about Passamaquoddy bay, and were promised One hundred acres of lands for themselves, and Fifty for their wives, and for each child. ---

That from various intervening impediments your Memorialist never received their full allotments of land which Government had at first given them good reason to expect would not have been delayed.

That during this long lapse of time your Memorialist have laboured under great difficulties to maintain themselves, and bring up large families of children, who, by the divine blessing have increased to a pleasing degree, as Your Honor will perceive by the annexed list of them. ---

That your Memorialist, stimulated by parental affection to provide for their offspring have anxiously sought for unoccupied lands whereon to form a settlement for themselves and families so that by their united endeavours they may be enabled to surmount their present hardships ---

That your Memorialist are informed of a Tract of Land lying between this county and the Oromocto river commonly called Pleasant Ridge, being in a wilderness ungranted, which if secured to your Memorialist by a Grant, might answer all their claims as to quality, and they believe is a good quality, and calculated for a large settlement. ---

Your Memorialist therefore humbly pray Your Honor will be pleased to Grant them such a portion of the above Tract of Land as may be sufficient for their accommodation and also reserve and lay out such portions of the same, as Your Honor may deem expedient for public purposes, as they with satisfaction look forward to a large and flourishing settlement there if their Memorial is compiled with, and Your Memorialist as in duty bound will ever pray ---
