## **Chapter 15 Taylor Families**

At least two generations of the Abraham Taylor family lived in the Tuscarora area between 1790 and the middle 1800s. The early Wetheringtons were closely connected to this Taylor family in the Tuscarora area.

Reportedly, Solomon's father, Thomas Wetherington, married a daughter of Abraham Taylor, Sr in Lenoir County.

Abraham Taylor, Sr also held a patent for 640 acres in Contentnea Neck and an Abraham Taylor, Jr held a patent for 640 acres at Bachelor Creek.

Abraham Taylor, Jr married Sarah Wetherington, a sister of Solomon Wetherington, in 1787 in Craven County. It appears that Abraham Taylor lived on his holdings in Tuscarora and between about 1785 – 1800 Sarah's brothers, Solomon, Thomas, William, Joseph, and James migrated from Lenoir County to the Rollover Creek area of Tuscarora.

Although many family accounts claim Solomon Wetherington received land grants for property on Bachelor Creek, the land records reveal that Solomon purchased property from Abraham Taylor in 1796. Other tracts were purchased from Andrew Richardson and Francis Moore. There were several land grants held by Abraham Taylor, Jr. in the Bachelor Creek area, but there are no recorded grants for Solomon Wetherington in the Bachelor Creek area in Craven County records.

**Alexander Taylor** (1776- after 1860) married Sarah Wetherington (1783 – after 1860), the daughter of Solomon Wetherington in April 4, 1803 in Craven County.<sup>1</sup> Alexander is listed in the 1840 Craven census<sup>2</sup> and the 1850 census lists Alexander Taylor as deaf along with Sarah and a probable grandson, Isaac Taylor, age 21.<sup>3</sup> Another Isaac Taylor, age 47, is also listed in the 1850 Craven census, their likely son. <sup>4</sup> Alexander and Sally Taylor also appear in the 1860 Craven census. <sup>5</sup>

**John Taylor** married Anna Wetherington (1797 – after 1860) a daughter of Solomon Wetherington, on January 21, 1820 in Craven County.<sup>7</sup> John apparently died before 1850.<sup>8</sup>

**Redding Taylor** married Dorcas Wetherington (1818/19-), the daughter of Jeremiah Wetherington on March 15, 1836 in Craven County. <sup>14</sup>

**Stephen Taylor** married **Rebecca Wetherington** (1820) – 1898, the daughter of Jeremiah Wetherington, in 1843 in Craven County. <sup>18</sup> Rebecca died in 1898 and was buried in the Gethsemane FWB Church cemetery at Tuscarora. <sup>19</sup>

**Alexander Taylor, Jr** married **Phoebe Wetherington** 1825 – 1909, daughter of Jeremiah Wetherington, in 1843 in Craven County. <sup>21</sup> In 1881 Phoebe married 2<sup>nd</sup>, Caswell Wood 1815 – 1895 in Craven County. <sup>22</sup> Phoebe and Caswell Wood are buried in the Asbury church cemetery. <sup>23</sup>

**Richelda Taylor**, the daughter of Abraham and Sarah Taylor, married **John Moore**, the father of John Clayton Moore on February 5, 1852 in Craven County. John and Richelda are buried in the Moore family cemtery in Tuscarora.

**Elizabeth Taylor** married Thomas Wetherington, the brother of Solomon, on January 11, 1788 in Craven County.

**Josiah Taylor**, the son of John Taylor and Anna Wetherington, married **Mary Stewart Moore**, the widow of Wiley Moore (1804-1850) in 1851 in Craven County. Mary Taylor died about 1877 and Josiah married 2<sup>nd</sup> Clara Ann Perkins in 1878 in Craven County.

**Lewis G. Taylor**, son of James O. and Sallie Taylor was born in 1838 and died in 1919. Reportedly never married, his sister, Mary Taylor, born about 1832 married an unknown Wetherington. Lewis G. Taylor is buried in Clarks, NC on the south side of the Craven County Industrial Park in the Taylor Cemetery.
