Lloyd D. Claycombe, Grandson of Prof. Johnson

**Indiana and Indianans: A History of Aboriginal
and Territorial . . . , Volume 4**

Lloyd D. Claycombe is one of the younger lawyers of the Indianapolis bar and has enjoyed a successful practice there for the past four years. He represents an old and honored family of Crawford County, and was born at Marengo in that county February 7, 1889. His maternal grandfather, John M. Johnson, was one of the early settlers of Crawford County, and was widely and favorably known all over that section of the state. He was an educator, minister and farmer, and was a visible example to an entire community for good works and good influence. He was a man of education, having attended the State University of Indiana when its building equipment was merely one frame building, as elsewhere illustrated in this publication.

Lloyd D. Claycombe is the only son and child of Victor E. and Roma A. (Johnson) Claycombe, and a grandson of Samuel A. Claycombe, who was a soldier in the Union Army. He enlisted in an Indiana regiment, was wounded and captured, and died in Andersonville Prison. Victor Claycombe was born at Alton, Indiana, and is now fifty-seven years of age. For thirtyfive years or more he has been a station agent with the Southern Indiana Railroad Company.

Lloyd D. Claycombe received his early education in the public schools of Jasper, Indiana. He took his law course in the Indiana State University. On July 1, 1914, he began the practice of law at Indianapolis, and has made rapid progress in achieving a substantial reputation in that field. He served as deputy prosecuting attorney of Marion County in 1917-18. In 1915 he was appointed receiver in trustee in bankruptcy for the Winona Assembly at Winona Lake, Indiana. He successfully reorganized this institution, with William J. Byan, president of the new

corporation, and Mr. Claycombe as member of the board of directors and an officer.

Mr. Claycombe is a republican, a member of the Methodist Church, is a Knight Templar Mason and Shriner, and is affiliated with the Lambda Chi Alpha and Gamma Eta Gamma college fraternities, September 14, 1918, he married Miss Jenetta Wuille, daughter of Louis Wuille, of Hamilton, Ohio.

Journal of the House of Representatives of the State of Indiana

By Indiana. General Assembly.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4 was read.
Mr. President:

To offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

A concurrent resolution directing the State Geologist and Curator of the Museum of the State of Indiana to turn over to the President of the 49th Indiana Infantry Regimental Association a certain gold headed ebony cane, presented to the State Museum by Lieutenant Kendall.

Whereas, on the 15th day of August, 1902, a survivor of the 49th Regiment of the Indiana Infantry presented to Colonel James Kegwin, a gold headed ebony cane as a token of the high esteem and deep affection they felt for their colonel; and

Whereas, said Colonel James Kegwin was greatly attached to said cane, and at his death, which occurred on August 25, 1904, he left a holograph will, disposing of said cane, which in part is as follows:

"The gold headed cane presented to me by the survivors of the 49th Indiana Volunteer Infantry at English, Indiana, August, 1902, forty-one years after they began their soldier life with me at Camp Joe Holt, 1861, was very highly appreciated by me and it is my wish and will that after my demise the cane remain with the survivors of the regiment so long as one of them remains to draw his quarterly stipend (commonly called a pension.)

First it is to go to Capt. W. W. Kendall, of Jasper, Indiana.

Second to Beverly Sullivan, of Indianapolis, Indiana.

Third to George B. Marshall, of Indianapolis, Indiana, and as Marshall was one of the youngest boys in the regiment he stands a good chance to be the last survivor, and should he be so fortunate as to be the last survivor, I want him to see that my great grandson, Harry Sherley Gays, of 45 Nicholson Place, St. Louis, Mo., receives it;" and

Whereas, the aforesaid cane of Colonel Kegwin came into the possession of said Kendall, pursuant to the terms of said will, and not otherwise; and

Whereas, without right and without authority so to do, said Kendall donated and presented said cane to the State Museum; and

Whereas, said Adjutant Beverly W. Sullivan and George B. Marshall, mentioned in said will as entitled to the possession of said cane, are willing to waive their respective rights to the possession thereof, and said Kendall has forfeited his right to the possession thereof; and

Whereas, the survivors of said 49th regiment by resolution, dated August 17, 1906, expressed themselves to the effect that said cane should be turned over to the President "of the 49th Indiana Regimental Association;

Therefore, be it resolved, by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, That the State Geologist and Curator of the Museum of the State of Indiana, is hereby authorized and directed to deliver said cane to the President of the 49th Indiana Infantry Regimental Association.

Excerpt from "Edward Hall and his Descendants", updated July 2005.

Edward Hall, Revolutionary War soldier (December 25, 1757 - July 13, 1838) Born in Prince William County, Virginia and died in Estill County, Kentucky.

The family information was compiled the old fashion way (before the age of computers) and recorded using a portable typewriter. The following were used to verify the information: court, census, military, cemetery, and church records. There were numerous interviews with elderly Hall relatives and family reunions. The first census to include all names of the family members was the 1850 census and is used as a key source for verifying the information collected. The oral history of the Hall family matches the backup documents found.

There was a William Hall and a Thomas Hall in Prince William County, Virginia in 1734. They seem to be indentured servants or work for George Mason of Gunston Hall. Gunston Hall was in the Northern Neck section of Virginia. It is possible that they leased land from George Mason. They could have been free Englishmen who agreed to work five years for the price of their passage from England to America. The Hall family may have moved closer to the western parts of Virginia because this is where soldiers were recruited for service in Kentucky which during the 1700s was a part of Virginia.

The way the sons were named in the 1700s: the first born son was named for the grandfather and the second or third son was named for the father. Name of Hall parents unknown

Parson Andrew Trimble married Edward and Milly Hall. Andrew Tribble headed a Separate Baptist Church at Tate's Creek (Madison Co., Ky.) from 1786 until his death in 1822. Before her marriage to Edward Hall, Milly was living in the home of Col. John Holder at John Holder's Station in Clark County, Kentucky. After their marriage, Edward and Milly lived at Fort Boonesborough in Madison County, Kentucky. Later the Hall's lived north of the Kentucky River in Clark and Estill counties.

The early stations in Kentucky were small compared to the forts. The only exception is Bryan Station which was the size of a fort. The stations were one or more cabins and those that lived there were usually families related by marriage, blood, or friendship. Milly (unknown) Hall was from Virginia. John Holder was from Frederick County, Virginia and married to Fanny Callaway. Edward Hall served under John Holder.

The reference for the children's names are from the Will of Edward Hall. The names of the children match the ages of children in the 1810 Clark County Census.

Edward Hall's Will is a key stone because it includes all of Edward's children. Garret Hall is mentioned in Milly (Unknown) Hall's, wife of Edward Hall, Revolutionary War pension statement.

Milly (Unknown) Hall gave birth to nine children. The first child was born seventeen months after their marriage (November 1787) and had died before the 1810 census. One of the nine children is thought to have been an infant and had died young. Issue:

Ambrose Powell explored Kentucky in 1750 with Dr. Thomas Walker. Powell Valley near the Cumberland Gap was named for Ambrose Powell. Dr. Thomas Walker and party named the Cumberland River. Tumbler's Run in eastern Kentucky was named for Ambrose Powell's dog. Ambrose Powell was the deputy surveyor from Culpeper County, Virginia.

The Ambrose Powell referenced may have been the grandfather of the Ambrose Powell (b. 1761) who was a Revolutionary War soldier and who lived in Estill County, Kentucky. In the 1700s, the first born son was named for the grandfather.
