At a Probate Court held in and for the County of Crawford in the State of Indiana and on Monday, the second day of November, 1829 at the Court House in Fredonia. Present: David Stewart, Probate Judge.

This day came Joseph Denbow and Ann Enlow and exhibited in open court the last will and testament of Jesse Enlow, deceased, which was proven according to law by Absalom Freeman, one of the subscribers. Therefore the administration of said estate is committed to the charge of the said Joseph Denbow and Ann Enlow with Phillip Crezelous and William Riley as their security.

Estate of Elijah Freid

And now at this time came John Freid, administrator of the Estate of Elijah Freid, deceased, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court from an inventory of the monies and effects of the said decedant in the hands of said administrator amounting to the sum of \$79.37, therefore it is considered by the court now here that said administrator be charged with the sum

Old Indiana Forts

Valeene Fort

(prehistoric), Valeene

An oval-shaped earth embankment along Patoka Creek once existed about one-half mile east of town, built by the ancient Mound Builders. No remains.

Blue River Camp

(1810's), near Fredericksburg

A fortified camp of the Northwest Rangers located southwest of town just across the present-day Harrison County line [in Crawford County], on the west bank of the Blue River, at the crossing of the old "Buffalo Trace".
