

# WAR OF 1812.

## DECLARATION OF SOLDIER FOR PENSION.

State of Tennessee } ss.  
COUNTY OF Anderson

On this 4<sup>th</sup> day of September, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy one, personally appeared before me, clerk of the County Court a Court of Record within and for the county and State aforesaid, James Cox, aged 82 years, a resident of 5<sup>th</sup> Civ District, County of Tenn State of Tennessee, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is married; that his wife's name was Ann Cox, to whom he was married

at Anderson Tenn on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September; that he served the full period of sixty days in the (1) Military service of the United States in the war of 1812; that he is the identical James Cox who (2) was drafted in Captain John Lewis's company, Jefferson's regiment, 1<sup>st</sup> brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> division, at Stuartville Tenn, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September

1814, and was honorably discharged at Stuartville Tenn on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September, 1814; that (3) he had land warrants granted by acts of March 3<sup>rd</sup> 1855 and previous acts and refers to his applications for said land warrants for further proof in support of this claim

that he, at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States, adhered to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; and that he will support the Constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provision of the act approved February 14, 1871, and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation;

William Wallace of Wallace Tenn his true

and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that his post

office is at Bullock County of Tenn State of Tennessee

that his domicile or place of abode is as stated
