DECLARATION OF SOLDIER FOR PENSION.

State of Yumpu }
COUNTY OF Anderson } ss.

On this 21st day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy one, personally appeared before me, clerk of the County Court, a Court of Record within and for the county and State aforesaid, James Cox aged ... years, a resident of 600 W. 1st Street, County of Anderson, State of Yumpu, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is married; that his wife's name was Elizabeth Hamman, to whom he was married in Yumpu County Yumpu, on the ... day of ... 18..., that he served the full period of sixty days in the ... service of the United States in the war of 1812; that he is the identical James Cox

who (2) ... in Captain ... company, ... regiment, ... brigade, ... division, at on the ... day of ... 181..., and was honorably discharged at ... on the ... day of ... 181...; that (3) he was in action

a land Warrent under act of Congress, approved 3^d March 1855, and refers to that application for further proof in support of this claim that his discharge papers

that he, at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States, adhered to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; and that he will support the Constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provision of the act approved February 14, 1871, and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation;

William Wallace his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that his post office is at Bullrun County of Anderson State of Yumpu; that his domicile or place of abode is as stated

James Cox his mark Applicant.
