Application of Widow of Soldier or Sailor of the Late Confederacy, under Chapter 108, Code of 1906 as amended by Chapter 333, Laws of 1924.

Application must be filed in duplicate with the Chancery Clerk on or before the first Monday in July 1924, and thereafter in September of the year in which the application is first filed.

- Q. 9. Are you an inmate of the Beauvoir Soldier's Home? Answer **No**
- Q. 10. Was your husband a bona fide citizen of the United States and of the State of Mississippi?
Answer **Yes**
- Q. 11. What was the date of your husband's enlistment? Answer **Aug 5, 1861**
- Q. 12. In what state, county and place did he reside when he enlisted? Answer **Ala, Mobile County,
Bayou La Batre**
- Q. 13. Give the names of officers of his company, regiment or vessel? Answer **General N. B. Forrest**
- Q. 14. Was he ever discharged from his command? Answer **No**
- Q. 15. If so, for what cause? Answer
- Q. 16. Was he in active service at the surrender in 1865? Answer **Yes**
- Q. 17. If not, why? Answer
