On this 16 day of August, 1897, at
Warrick County of Indiana
 State of Indiana, before me, James H. Coleman a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Mary W.
Walker, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: my age is 48 years, was born
October 27, 1848, I am the wife of John Walker, P.O.
address Warrick, Ind. Co., Ind. My maiden name
was Mary W. Walker, I am a daughter of the late Thomas
B. Walker and his wife Elizabeth Walker, whose maiden
name was Elizabeth Nash. My said father was a soldier
in the late war of the rebellion in the 6. term Reg. I have
seen his discharge certificate, but don't remember that I
ever read it. I heard it read and remember that he was di-
charged on account of disability, but don't remember the
particulars or date of substitution or discharge. I don't remember
the date of his death, but he died in October about three years after
his discharge. I have his old family Bible in which his death
is recorded. I think my sister Leaton gave me now lives in
Kansas wrote the entry of his death. He is buried on their place
and the date of his death is on his tombstone. (Record in Bible
shows he died Oct. 23, 1886). He died of Chills and fever, which
he had for ten days before he died. I don't know the date of mar-
riage of my father and mother. (It is not of record in the family
Bible). They were married in Big Valley about 9 miles from
here, as I was informed by them. My said father had been
previously married, as mother informed me. Mother was
not previously married. Don't know the name of father's
first wife. Don't know where he married his first wife.
No I don't know whether said first wife is living. I did
hear my mother say he was divorced from his first wife.
Never heard my father say he had been divorced from his
first wife. No I don't know any person who could inform
