Raccoon Valley, County of Union
State of Tennessee, before me, James M. Clements, a
Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Benjamin F.
Walker, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
pension claim, deposes and says: my age is 45 years, I was born on the
23 day of October 1857, as I was taught by my parents
always know my age from early childhood, Occupation
farmer, P.O. address Raccoon Valley, Union Co., Tenn.
I am a son of the late Thomas B. Walker, who died in
October 1866, have forgotten the date, I was present when
he died. The immediate cause of his death was Chills and
fever, which he had as I remember as much as six weeks,
but am not certain as to time, I don't know of any other
disease he had at that time, I don't know about his con
dition before he enlisted, but he was not stout after
the War, or after he came home from the Army, I
am the identical Benjamin F. Walker, who made
application for pension as son of Thomas B. Walker
and swore to it before H. T. Carden, County Clerk on
the 13 day of December 1893, I understand your
questions, my answers are correctly recorded in this
deposition
