

My mother had twelve children, by my father Thomas B. Walker, they are all living but one who was married except all the others were living when I last heard from them. The children were named respectively, Ester Grace, Sarah K. Thessa Ann, Nancy W. Mahala, Benjamin & Howard McClay, Corley Eve, Thagtha A. Watson, John Col. Leroy, and Rebecca S. Walker. I can't give the ages of each of said children, but they are recorded in the family Bible, now in the possession of my sister Nancy Graves. I was at home when my father died. I was single when he died, he died in the month of October 1866. He had been sick to date of his death, and that was supposed to be the cause of his death, he had Chills and fever for probably a month before he died. He never appeared well after he was discharged from the Army, & I don't know how long he had been discharged when he died, but I think he had been discharged about two years. I don't know what particular disease he had after discharge before he had Chills and fever, but I often heard him speak to matters of a hunting in his side, he did some work after discharge, but complained of being unable to work hard or make a full hand. Yes I did hear him complain of pain in his back before he was listed, but not so bad as after discharge. & I don't know the cause of the Chills and fever he had to date of his death. He was not a very strong man before he was listed but could do the regular work on the farm. If I ever had a milder name I don't remember hearing it. I am the identical Mahala Cox who filed a claim for pension as the child of Thomas B. Walker. I cannot read or write. I understood that my father and mother were married on a license issued in Blair County Pa. Penn. I consider all your questions, my answers are correctly recorded as read over to me.
