Case of Widows of Thomas B. Walker, No. 414690

On this 18 day of August, 1897 at
Pranton, County of Knox

State of Tennessee, before me, James H. Clements, a
Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Florence A. C. Davis
who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid
pension claim, deposes and says: My age is 33 years, wife of T. B. Davis.

P.O. address, Pranton Knox Co. Tenn. I have been taught from
my earliest recollection that I was born on the 12 day of May
1864. My maiden name was Florence A. C. Walker. I do not
remember my father, but I have always been taught that
his name was Thomas B. Walker, and that he was a soldier
in the 6 Tenn. Vol. Inf. I remember my mother, her name
was Elizabeth Walker. I have forgotten the date of her death.
She and my father are buried side by side, on the farm where
my mother died. I am a claimant for pension as a child
of Thomas B. Walker. I am now with my sister Mrs
Amanda N. Hyman, whose maiden name was Amanda
N. Walker. I depend on my older sister and brother
for proof of my right to pension. I am the youngest
of my father and brother's children. I understand
your questions, My answers are correctly recorded
in this deposition.
