Directions to Examiners.

It is respectfully requested that you furnish as full a medical history as practicable in the following-described case:

Name and Service of Soldier.

Give as far as possible the names of all companies and numbers of all regiments, and the term of the service in which soldier served, with the dates of enlistments and transfers, and date, place, and cause of discharge or muster-out.

*Thomas B. Walker enlisted March 17, 1862 at Barkhousville Tenn in Co. E. 6 Tenn vol and was discharged for disability March 23, 1863.*

Allegations of Claimant in regard to Fatal Disease or Injury.

Give name of disease or injury, time and place of origin or receipt; (if wounded in action, the name of the action;) mention hospital in which treated, in order of date, giving name, (or number,) character, (whether regimental, post, brigade, division, corps, or general,) definite location, and as near as practicable, dates of admission and exit, (or duration of treatment in each.)

*Taken sick at Cumberland Gap about July 1862, and unable for service there after.*

Report of Adjutant General U. S. Army.

Give similar information to that indicated in above note; also dates of rolls on which reported present, and dates and full questions from rolls on which reported "absent sick" or "wounded."

*Report discharged at Murfreesboro Tenn March 23, 1863.*

Death of Soldier.

Give date, place, and cause of death, stating particularly whether soldier was then in service or discharged, or on furlough, and when on furlough give hospital or place from which furloughed.

*Lied at home Oct 28, 1866 no further data*
