Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 214694, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Records on file in this Office that Thomas B. Walker was enrolled on the 17th day of Mich, 1862, at Burtonsville in Co. D, 6th Regiment of Tenn Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 22nd day of Apr, 1862 at Williamsburg, in Co. D, 6th Regiment of Tenn Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. D, of that Regiment, for the months of March and April, 1863 he is reported "Discharged on Surge Certificate of disability March 23/63" For M/O'Row &c. repts - same Leads of Disability reports him dischd. at Mansfield Tenn, March 23rd, 1863.
