& State aforesaid as follows.

her husband Gabriel Cox, late of the District & State aforesaid, departed this life, seized  
& possessed of the following tracts of land, situate lying & being in the District of Abbeville  
& State aforesaid to wit the Homestead tract, containing five hundred & fifty acres more or  
less, and bounded by lands of Peter B. Moragne Pharis Martin, Albert Gibert, Joseph L.  
Bouchillon & others, and the other tract, being that purchased of the said deceased from  
Joseph L. Bouchillon Senior, containing one hundred & fifty five acres, more or less &  
bounded by lands of Lewis J. or I? Patterson, Peter B. Moragne & others, and leaving  
as the heirs & distributees your oratrix & the following named children Augustus M. Cox,  
Malcom S. Cox, Jane Jacobs the wife of Samuel J Jacobs, Aschal Newby the wife of Wiley  
Newby, Sarah Cox the wife of Lucius D. Cox, Emily Isom the wife of John Isom, John  
C. Cox & Mary Cox of whom the last two named are minors under the age of        years.

Administration of all & singular the goods & chattels, rights & credits, which were of the  
said Gabriel Cox deceased has recently been granted to Peter L. Guillebeau, of the District  
& State aforesaid by William Hill Ordinary of Abbeville District & he has assumed & is now

discharging the duties of the said administration. And your oratrix further sheweth that the  
personal estate of her deceased husband, is much more than sufficient to pay the debts of  
the Estate, which are inconsiderable.

Your oratrix believes & submits, that it would be to the advantage of the parties  
interested that partition be made of the tract of land above described, and therefore  
asks of this Honorable Court, an order directing partition thereof, according to  
the Acts of Assembly in such case made & provided.

And your oratrix as in duty bound will ever pray &c.

from B.E. Gibert, containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less, and bounded  
by lands of B.E. Gibert, xxxx O.T. Porcher and others.

In 1859 Augustus M. Cox, Samuel Jacobs & his wife Jane were residing out of the state.

John W. Isom was written on another page...Also Daniel L. Cox mentioned as a distributee...  
Settlement made eb. 15, 1867 mentioned Agness Cox now Mrs. Lane admnrx. Mrs. Emily  
Isom, D.L. Cox xx and wife Sarah, G.W. Cox, Wiley Newby in right of wife Achsal. Absent

were Nicholas E. Brown and wife Jane C., Dr. A.M. Cox, John C. Cox, Marion Stuckey and wife Mary. ,. L. Cox died since intestate unmarried.
