



The laurels go to Bob Witzdam for doing such an outstanding job on a difficult role. He captivated the audience with his sarcasms and witticisms.


The cast, under the direction of Mr. Seeley, truly did an excellent job in this comical farce.




In the winning of the Olympic League, it was the first time a team of P. T. H. S. had ever attained that position. It was also the first time in the league history that a "B" team had won first place.


The winning of first place in the district tournament gives this title to the Redskins two years in a Row. The Redskins had also won a nigh place in the district tourney in 1947.
