Although it was at that time only a high bluff rising out of the water, from its founding it grew and prospered, surviving through panic and prosperity. Two forts, Worden and Flagler, brought many people to Port Townsend in the early twentieth century. After the First World War a Crown Zellerbach paper mill was brought to town. Port Townsend survived through good as well as bad. There was a good reason to have a gala centennial May the next hundred years be as eventful as the last!

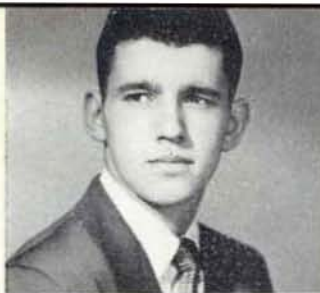

The junior year brought forth more talent in their assembly. Dick Larsen playing his guitar was an outstanding feature.

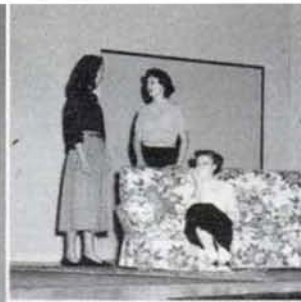
Then came the Junior Prom. "1 Hawaiian Sunset." It was hard work but enjoyed by all.

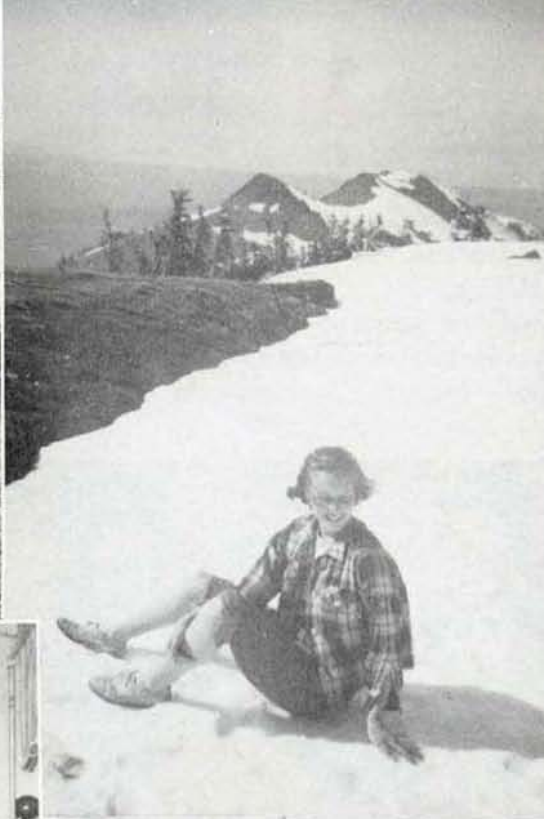

"Out of the Frying Pan" was the name of the all school play this year held April 13 in the auditorium.

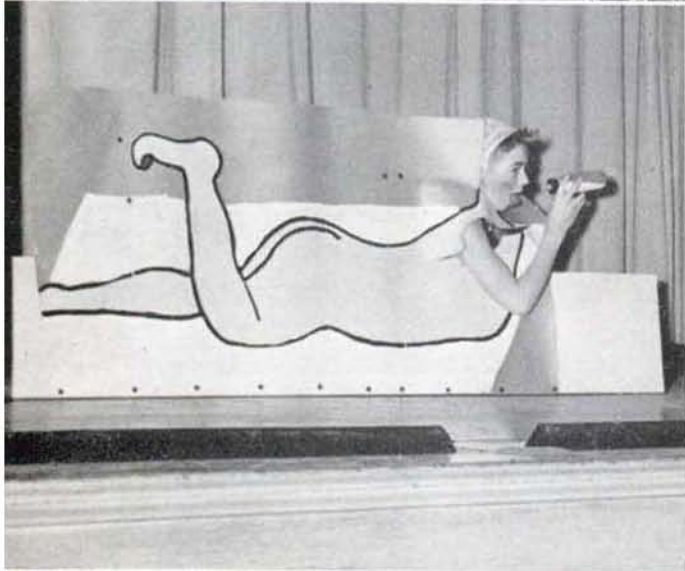
