Although it was at that rime only a high bluff rising out of the water, from its founding it grew and prospered. surviving through panic and prosperity. Two forts, Worden and Flagler, brought many people to Port Townsend in the early twentieth century. After the First World War a Crown Zellerbach paper mill was brought to town. Port Townsend survived through good as well as bad. There was a good reason to have a gala centennial May the next hundred years be as eventful as the last!
