Allen Gilliland, in consideration of military
service performed by James Yarbrough to the
State of North Carolina, warrant No. 42, dated
the first day of October, 1801, and entered on the 12th
day of August, 1807, by No. 541. There is granted
by the said State of Tennessee unto Allen Gilliland,
assignee of the heirs of the said James Yarbrough,
a certain tract or parcel of land, containing two
hundred acres, part of said warrant, lying in
Overton County, in the third district, in the fourteenth
section, beginning at a large hickory and dogwood
in Northern boundary line of said section, running
thence South one hundred and seventy-nine poles
to two hickories and a dogwood; thence west
one hundred and seventy-nine poles to two hick-
ories in the Eastern boundary of a tract of school
land, in said section; thence North with the same
one hundred and seventy-nine poles to two hickories;
thence East, one hundred and seventy-nine poles
to the beginning. Surveyed the 28th of December,
1808, by James Chisum, D.S. — with the here-
ditaments and appurtenances, to have and
to hold the said tract of land with its appur-
tenances to the said Allen Gilliland and his
heirs forever. In witness whereof, Willie Blount,
Governor, of the State of Tennessee hath hereunto
set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the

81 Acres, on Wolf River,
Alexander Davidson.

The State of Tennessee No. 2733.
 Know ye, that in consideration of an entry made in the office of the Surveyor of the fourth district of number 501, dated the 21st day of November, 1809 founded on a certificate of Num 130, issued by Anthony Foster to John McDonald for six hundred and forty acres of land, dated the 18th day of November, 1808, one hundred acres of which is vested in Alexander Davidson, the enterer,

There is granted by the said State of Tennessee unto the said Alexander Davidson and his heirs a certain tract or parcel of land containing eighty one acres, lying in the County of Overton in the district of Winchester on the waters of Wolf river, beginning at a white oak marked W. D; thence east one hundred poles to a dogwood; north one hundred and eighty poles to three dogwoods near a cliff of rocks; west one hundred and twenty-poles to a hickory; south one hundred and eighty poles to a dogwood; then a direct line to the beginning. Surveyed December the 15th 1809. With the hereditaments and appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with its appurtenances, to the said Alexander Davidson and his heirs forever.

In Witness whereof, Willie Blount, Governor of the State of Tennessee hath hereunto set his hand and caused the great seal of the said State to be affixed at Nashville on the first day of April
