To the Waters of Spring Creek  
James Gilleland

So all to whom these presents  
shall come Granting; Know  
ye, that by virtue of entry n<sup>o</sup>  
15 1/2 made in the office of  
the entry Taker of Overton County; and en-  
tered on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of November 1836

pursuant to the provisions of an act of the General Assembly of said State  
passed on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of January 1836. there is granted by the said State of  
Tennessee unto James Gilleland a certain tract or parcel of land containing  
one hundred and five and three fourth acres by survey bearing date the 18<sup>th</sup>  
day of December 1837 lying in said County on the Waters of Spring Creek be-  
ginning at two hickories the South west corner of the tract where  
Allen Gilleland now lives running nine poles to a small dogwood and point-  
ers on Joseph Andersons East boundary line; thence North with the same  
eighty two poles to two black-oaks said Andersons North East corner; West  
with Andersons North boundary line thirty six poles to a small black gum  
three black gums and hickory pointers on the East boundary line of a  
tract surveyed in the name of Jesse Conway; North with the same sixty two  
poles to a stake and two hickories and a black-oak pointer Conways corner  
west with Conways North boundary line one hundred and fifty poles to two  
black-oaks and a post-oak; North sixty poles to a black oak six poles North  
Eastward of James Copelands corner; then East two hundred and sixty four poles to a  
hickory on the West boundary line of a survey in the name of Thomas Cannon; South  
with the same passing Cannons corner twenty four poles to a small Chermut and  
dogwood pointers on said Allen Gillelands North boundary line; West with the same  
69 poles to a black-oak said Allen Gillelands North West corner; South with his  
North boundary line to the beginning; with the hereditaments and appurtenances  
to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances  
unto the said James Gilleland and his heirs forever. In Witness Whereof  
A Cotton Cannon Governor of the State of Tennessee has hereunto set his hand  
and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed at Nashville on the  
5<sup>th</sup> day of January 1838 and 6<sup>th</sup> year of our Independence.
