

Allen Gilleland  
Dued 100 acres by n<sup>o</sup>  
4262 & by entry 341  
to  
James Gilleland  
lying on the waters of roaring  
river in Overton County

This Indenture made and entered into between Allen Gilleland of the one part: and James Gilleland of the other part: both of the County of Overton and State of Tennessee, Witnesseth, that the said Allen Gilleland on his part, for and in consideration of Five hundred dollars to him in hand paid: the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged: And have this

day bargained and sold unto the said James Gilleland his heirs and assigns all that certain tract or parcel of land: Situate lying and being in the said County of Overton and on the Waters of Roaring River it being part of a two hundred acre tract No 4262 Sued by warrant in the name of Allen Gilleland n<sup>o</sup> 42 dated the first day of October 1801. And entered in the 12<sup>th</sup> day of August 1807 by n<sup>o</sup> 341. bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at two Hickories the South west corner of said tract of land: running north one hundred and seventy nine poles to a black oak the north west corner of said tract of land: thence East Seventy nine poles to a hickory: thence South twenty poles to a small hickory: thence East fifty nine poles to a red oak at the north end of said James Gillelands lane: thence South thirty three poles with the lane passing said James Gillelands dwelling house to his big Gate: thence west fifty nine poles including said James Gillelands barn to a Stake: thence South one hundred and twenty five poles to a Stake: thence Seventy nine poles to the beginning containing in all one hundred acres be it the same more or less. The said James Gilleland for himself his heirs & assigns to have and to hold the before recited tract of land & bargained premises with all and singular the appurtenances and hereditaments thereunto belonging in any wise appertaining: to the only use and benefit of him the said James Gilleland his heirs and assigns. And the said Allen doth hereby: and by these presents do warrant and forever defend the before recited land and bargained premises against the claim or claims of all and every person or persons claiming through or by the said Allen Gilleland his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof I the said Allen Gilleland have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this the 25<sup>th</sup> day of December A D one thousand eight hundred and forty one State of Tennessee
