Here I am again. Thanks for returning the stamps. Have put another one on this letter. Am gradually getting the State Flag stamps back. Up to 21 now.

Have read a lot on the Big Bend Park but have never been there. That section seems to have had contact with some ancient visitors, also.

Have never tried the Hondas. Preferred the Jeep four wheel drives and then shanks mares for the hard going in late years. Years ago I went by horse and mule or burro train. Used my two old Apache Blood brothers, Jim and Frank, for explorations in Mexico. Used a Mexican burro boy for trips in this country.

You are so right on the guess part on the religious bit. I am in doubt as to his being kin to John D. Mitchell. Several reasons will appear later. Will look them up in the old directories one of these days. All of John D.'s kids spoke Spanish as their mother spoke very little english. What about Mitch?

John D. was born in MO. Graduated as a mining engineer at Rolla, MO. Then went to Mexico. He was part Spanish and spoke the language well. He has been dead for a number of years now. His wife is still around but will not talk to anyone. She lives in Chandler, AZ.

Encino sparked a memory. I received the son of John D. from the same person. He is a Fom Probert, a friend of mine. He is a Pegleg, Stone Maps, Tumacacori, and LDM fan. Tom got his notion from "Jack Black"--Robert Ames-- who started Western Treasures. I talked to Ames but he is so far out I really did not believe he knew anything, altho he swore he had met Clarence. Could be.

Before I forget. Doc told me that Noble, an LDM and Stone Map fan, says Mitch is running a Rock Shop in Yuma. Have had no chance to check this out.

I think the Pumlinsons just hung out at Florence Junction, or his uncleded. Travis may have worked on the Farms and orchards in those years. The Valley filled up with migrant farm workers during the depression.

I queried Doc on several matters. His pictures are home made. He says the stones appear rougher and larger, etc. Will have to visit him and have a good look at them. I do not know how Mitch and the Carson City men got together. One of them is a lawyer. Thus Mitch would have kept in touch with him. That maybe a way to get some info. Will try same.

Lileen's death certificate can be obtained from Vital Statistics Dept. at State Capitol. Same is true for Travis in Oregón. Researching authors can obtain such for a small fee. Usually \$2. One must know approximate date of death, plus names, places, etc., or enough for them to identify the deceased. Survivor's names help.

You have my permission to send all the names, including Nevada men, to the Lady(Pam). State of Texas may have a death certificate on Travis as well since he was buried there. Why not contact Vital Statistics Dept. and find out? Give them the information and ask if they have the death certificates on them. If so then you can get them.

Letter from Pam mentions a "Nephew" of Mitch's whom the Mansons knew. Why not get his address, etc., from Pam. Or have Pam get in touch for you. The "Nephew" of Mitch must know a great deal. The Hanons must have found out there was something dishonest in "Mitch" and want he was up to. It also seems that Mitch became acquainted with Travis during the period the Hanons knew him. This is why Mitch got in touch with them.

There was one tape on the Priest map side of no. 1. It covers the heart below the word <u>COAZON</u>. There is another heart below cross in the Witch's hands and next to it 8-N-OQ This last to the eye looks like a P. or an O P. P has a small circle in it. The Heart under the Tape has two 7's and a 2(or what looks like such). Below the tape on the Witch side is 3.

One tape on the Horse side of No. 1 map covers DESANTAFE. This is under COBOLLO. The other tape in the upper left corner covers a 5.

The tapes on #2 stone cover 2=3 and 18 of 18=7.

On map # 3 the samll tape in upper right hand corner covers an R. Big tape near point of heart covers. Tapes inside heart cover 10 @ an a .

The arrow on the heart that fits in the hole points to the 18th Place.

Designated thus @. A church visita, not a Mission. There is a large 1 on the curving tale of the arrow. A 1 at the tale end of an arrow is very significant in symbols.

The l is on your drawings in FT. Mitch only shows the 1,000,000 in his book. This is why I say the original stone had no cut out heart. This was done later. By whom is the question. Not why, Your HOAX article in FT told why. To make it fit the Florence quad.

The equation is a big bit of nothing. Addition is wrong. Kak Length of Vara used is wrong. V. stands for Vara. If Travis did it, and I assume he did then he used the DATE 1847 times the 18 places equals 33,246 V(varss). He used 2.8 feet as a vara. He then changed a Mile English into a mile Spanish(There ain't so such), but he dooed it. The vara is 3 inches less than a yard so he deducted XMX 149.4 Ft. from 5,280 Ft. which gives 5,103.6 Ft. Then he multiplied this by the 18 places and came up with 93,350.8. Bad multiplication as it comes to only 92,350.8 Ft. He then divided 5,280 into 93,350.8 and got 17.6 miles.

How is that for unraveling a large hunk of nothing? Who ever chisled that third stone must be laughing in his grave. So must the one who chisled the two reiginal stones. Perhaps the laughter helps ease thier misery in HELL! (I hope you do not think I have a warped sense of humor!).

The Esta el Mapa and Esta el Coazon plus 3-n-P plus No Pedro and no Sonora, Nex., and no Miguel suggests there was another stone with Horse and Witch on them. I wonder what happened to it?

I doubt that all three have been copied. Since the other two are Grave stones then they would only have been altered. Thus the Original Horse Witch stone could be a denser stone than the New one. This brings up something I forgot to mention.

I mentioned that the Horse-Witch stone was lighter in color and weight than the other two. It also has grass roots and tree roots imbedded in it. The TWO DENSER STONES DO NOT!

Doc tells me there is a lot of light colored sandstone near the Heart on the hill. May have to get some and compare with the Horse-Witch stone.

On the explanation of the stones. I mentioned De Santa Fe is under COBOLLO. But there is no 3-N-P, no 8-N-P, and no heart there.

Some of my old friends still call me Jack or Frank and will swear that that is my real name. I answer to all such when so addressed.

I think the Tomlinson came because that is what it sounded like.
Tomlinson is a rarer name than Tumlinson also. I have found a lot of names were different than what people told me they were. A lot of westerners sure hashed up names. Even the editors of newspapers did this.

The records for Waltz in Brown County, Miss. were filed under M for Maltz. In CA Census he was called Walls. His friends in Prescott called him Walty and that is the name used by the recorder on a claim on which his name appears.

Does that answer your question on the names? Even Mitch used "Jack" which I am sure he called Travis by.

The best laugh I had was of a Mexican, Spaniard, or what have you, sitting out in the wilderness with fine carving tools, carving the stones while the fierce apaches were hunting him to give the business. I have a soft spot for the area around St. John's. My old blind Pima Chief lived a short distance from there. We used to sit on the house porch in the cool shade and he would just talk or read from the "History Sticks" for me. He taught me many things as well as made me rich in white man's goods-in my case gold and silver. He told me about the Spaniards, not Peraltas, who had the mines in the area and where most of the mines were. He died when I was off to war. He was 126 years old when he died.

The old Chief told me about the ONE and ONLY Jesiut treasure and where it was. He even gave me an accurate list of the things it contained. How to get into the place to see it and to check his inventory of it. But I was not to remove even one little item of it as it belonged to the Pimas and not the Jesuits. The Pimas wish to salvage it and bring it to the Reservation and put it in their Museum. Last year while I was still in Salome a delegation of Pimas came to see me and to urge me to help them get it and bring it up here. It is in Sonora Mexico. They said the Pimas down there would help brying it up and smuggle it over the border. All I was to do was to oversee the operation. Afterward I was to get certain things worth a lot of money from the total.

I was quite interested in the story of Travis in Mexico and the part about him talking to a Priest and to a Mexico. The Mexicans know that the treasure belongs to the Pimas. That is the older ones do. These also know that it is bad to try and remove it.

The Priest on the other hand would like to get it for the Mexican government and so wanted it all. Inspite of the fact that he told Travis he could unscramble the puzzle he could not do so.

I do not know what kind of a Priest Travis saw, but that would make no difference as no Priest I know of can unscramble the thing. Most Priest in Sonora are lay priest. None are Jesuits that I know of. Nor do I know of any Franciscans there either. No lay priest or any Franciscan or Jesuit unscramble the thing.

Or start from the 1st place to find the Mines near the 18th place. The mines are shown on the Heart Stone. The "Witch" was at the 1st place and is now at the 18th place.

There is a large "Witch" made of stones at Sacaton Village. There is also a "Witch" lying down on a Mountain above the 18th place. The "Witch" is there to mislead all who seek the big treasure. The treasure is at the birthplace of the "Witch" near the 1st place.

Thus one needs only the stones No. 2 and No. 3. Put No 3 above No. 2, and solve the puzzle. The other or third stone must have only had the "Witch" carved on it plus some other symbols. It also would be a dense stone and of the same color as stones No. 2 and No. 3. This is the stone I am looking for. What is depicted on the third stone that Mitch had has nothing to do with the treasure at all. It was carved to make it fit the Florence Quad as you so aptly found out.

The 18th place is the old Jesuit Vista where St. John's Mission now stands. Thus the two original map stones show the Gila and a river in Sonora, Mexico, only.
