Notes for Thomas Smith:

(David C. Smith's) ancestors were descendants of that colony of sturdy Scotch Presbyterians from Argyleshire which settled in the Province of Ulster, Ireland, in the year 1612. Here this colony bore the brunt of the siege of Londonderry, and were the right hand of King William in the battle of Boyne Water; but being persecuted by their vastly more numerous Catholic neighbors, after James II had been routed from Ireland, a party of sixteen families emigrated to New Hampshire in 1719.

These families settled in what was known as "the Irish township" of Rockingham county and were joined in later years by many others of their Protestant fellow-countrymen, who settled in Rockingham and Hillsborough counties. By an act of Parliament, as survivors of the siege of Londonderry their farms were exempt from taxation until after the Revolution and were known as "Free Lands." But none were more valiant than the descendants of those brave colonists in resisting British aggression and tyranny in the war for American independence.

The first member of the family to settle in America was "Lieutenant" Thomas Smith, who was the great grandfather of David Smith. It is believed that he was a survivor of the siege of Londonderry, and that he earned his title by loyal service to King William, though he was equally active for the Colony of New Hampshire in its wars with the Indians.

### Notes for John Smith:

In the war of the Revolution "Deacon" John Smith, of Francestown, was a Soldier in Capt. Isaac Farwell's company of the First New Hampshire Infantry, (Co1. Joseph Cilley's regiment),

He first enlisted for a single campaign. Then at once reenlisted on February 22, 1777, for "three years, or the war," continuing in the service more than seven years.

"... and in the campaign against Burgoyne was wounded at the battle of Bennington, by a bullet in the neck which was never removed."

Although a private, or non-commissioned officer, he was sometimes called "Captain" Smith, and his name appears among the Revolutionary pensioners of Ne Hampshire as late as 1824.

## Notes for David Campbell Smith:

On January 18, 1817, David Smith, then less than two years a resident of Ohio, was elected by the Legislature Associate Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for Franklin county to succeed Alexander Morrison, Jr. The term of office was seven years, but Judge Smith resigned in November, 1825 to accept a seat as Representative from Franklin county in the Twenty-Fifth General Assembly, in 1826.

. . .

The following year, early in 1816, David Smith and Ezra Griswold, Jr., established and commenced the publication of the Ohio Monitor, a weekly protective tariff, anti-slavery Democratic newspaper. ... Mr. Griswold soon sold his interest in the Monitor to Judge Smith, who remained sole proprietor and editor of the paper until October 5th, 1836, more than twenty years, when he sold it to Jacob Medary.

. .

In 1820, and again in 1822, the State printing was given by joint resolution of the General Assembly to the Ohio Monitor, though it does not appear that its editor was known as the "State Printer". This office was not created by the Ohio Legislature until the session of 1824-25, and was' evidently considered of more importance then than it is to-day. George Nashee was the first incumbent of the new office, and David Smith was successively elected State Printer three times by the Legislatures of 1831, 1832 and 1833.

On September 27, 1836, David Smith was appointed by his friend, Amos Kendall, Postmaster General, to a clerkship in the Dead Letter Office at Washington. He continued in the Government service for a number of years, probably until after the inauguration of President Polk in 1845.

. . .

David Smith was for very many years - probably more than sixty - a devout, consistent and useful member of the Methodist Episcopal Church: He was among the first officers of the old Town Street M. E. Church at Columbus, and was for a long time superintendent of its Sabbath School

... until within a few months of his death. This occurred, after a stroke of paralysis, and lingering sickness, in February, 1865. His sufferings were intense; he was almost speechless, articulating only with the greatest difficulty,

### Notes for John Wallace Gill:

John W. Gill, Sr. was educted with others, afterward notable in Ohio and national history, under a very able tutor and instructor, a Mr. Brooks, at St. Clairsville, O. He early developed into a great business man, adn about 1840, removed to Wheeling, West Va. where for many years he took a leading part in public affairs and enterprises, and engaged successfully, in many kinds of business.

He was founder of the Wheeling Seminary; took a prominent part in the erection of the great Suspension Bridge; the projection and completion of the National Pike highway; encouraged and owned stock in the first telegraph line, and in many other public enterprises of that early day.

He engaged in merchandising and marketing by flatboat between Wheeling and New Orleans; in banking; in paper manufacture; in iron and steel manufacture, and was particularly active in the culture of Silk cocoons, and the manufacture of fine silks and velvets; these productions were beautiful in design and substantial in quality, and took many medals at fairs, both at home and abroad. A number of these medals are kept in the family of the late Charles W. Gill at Galveston, Texas. He manufactured and introduced the first Silk American flag. It is difficult to compress into brief space the many interesting phases of his active career.

The deplorable business reverses and depression prevailing in the Buchanan administration, swept away much, if not all his accumulations and in 1864, he acquired a large block of land just west of Springfield, Ill. Here he spent the last years of his life in clearing and improving and bringing into a high state of cultivation a valuable farm, from rough hilly land and virgin forest. After his death in 1872, the family reaped the benefits of his foresight, work and genius, and for more than fifty years this farm was a home for his widow and children and did not pass away from them until after her death in 1907.

In stature tall, in demeanor dignified and commanding, of urbane disposition, quick in perception and action, he attracted and received consideration from all with whom he came in contact, and was adored by his wife and family as the embodiment of wisdom and knowledge.
