LONG-TERM Bulahdelah resident Kevin Carter has announced he will run for Great Lakes Council in September's local government elections, saying he would like to be a champion of the region's villages.

"I want to ensure that the little villages; Bulahdelah, Nabiac, Cooloongolook, Bunghwhal and places like that, which are outside the main growth areas, are able to maintain essential basic services," Mr Carter says.
