DANIEL SLOAN 1811-1888

This sketch contributed by a great-granddaughter, Miss Varnie Sloan of 220 Beach Place, Tampa, Florida 33606.

Daniel Sloan was born in 1811 in Duplin County, North Carolina, son of John Sloan (born 1783) and Rachel Alderman (born January 12, 1787) and grandson of David Alderman and Jemima Hall. As a young boy, he moved with his parents to Thomas County in southern Georgia about 1827. He grew up in that section of Thomas County which was later made into Colquitt County.

On August 6, 1835 in Thomas County, Daniel married Miss Nancy Lanier. She was born in 1814, daughter of John and Esther Lanier of Sampson County, North Carolina. Daniel and Nancy Sloan had 13 children:

1. Alford Sloan, born 1837; died 1892; married 1st, Cecilia Whiddon, daughter of Willoughby Whiddon and Eliza Pennington, on September 4, 1856 in Hillsborough County, Florida; he married, 2nd, Josephine Parker in Polk County, Florida on February 3, 1882.
2. Owen Sloan, born November 17, 1840; died April 2, 1911; married in Hillsborough County, Florida on March 1, 1860 Jane Elizabeth Platt, daughter of Peter Platt.
3. Orval Sloan, born August 11, 1841; died April 13, 1925; married Sarah M. Frier, daughter of Henry Milton Frier and Elizabeth Rushing, in Polk Co., Florida on January 14, 1864.
4. Elbert Sloan, born December 17, 1842; died Jan. 15, 1914; married in Polk County on December 24, 1863 Eleanor Raulerson, daughter of John Baggs Raulerson and Civility Frier. Eleanor Raulerson and Sarah M. Frier were first cousins.
5. Rachel Sloan, born 1846; married 1st, Robert Wiggins on July 12, 1860; married 2nd, John Sylvester on September 17, 1863 in Hillsborough County.
6. Catherine Sloan, born 1847; married William H. H. Frier, son of Henry Milton Frier and Elizabeth Rushing and brother of Sarah M. Frier, on March 1, 1866 in Polk County, Florida.
7. Wealthy Ann Sloan, born 1849; married William Futch on September 27, 1866 in Polk County.
8. Linton Sloan, born 1850; married Virginia Merritt
9. Oregon Sloan, born 1852; died October 8, 1899; married Robert James Merritt.

10. John Sloan, born 1854; died 1927; never married.
11. Gibson Sloan, born 1856; died 1925; married on December 18, 1878, Rena Carlton, daughter of Isaac Carlton.
12. Cuthbert Sloan, born 1859; married Will McQuaig on December 15, 1876.
13. William Sloan, born 1863; died October 19, 1941; married Mary Jane Gaskets in 1886.

Daniel Sloan was residing in Thomas County, Georgia in both the 1840 and 1850 Census. In 1850, he was living in the same household with his younger brother, Dickson Sloan. He and his family moved to south Florida about 1852 settling in Hillsborough County near Plant City.

Daniel Sloan fought in the indian wars in Georgia and Florida. He was a Private in the company commanded by Capt. James Numan in the regiment commanded by Col. Young. He volunteered in June or July of 1837 by reason of an order from the Governor of Georgia to march against the indians and was honorably discharged in September or October of 1837. He was also a Private in the company commanded by Capt. Levi J. Knight in the regiment commanded by Col. Hall. He volunteered in September or October of 1838 and was discharged in December 1838 or January of 1839. He received for his services a Land Warrant for 40 acres by the Act of 1850 and later received a Bounty Land Warrant for 120 acres by the Act of 1855.

Besides his war services in the Georgia Militia, he was very active in the Florida Seminole Indian Wars. As a Private in Capt. Hooker's Company of Florida Mounted Volunteers, he served from January 3, 1856 when he was mustered in at Fort Meade till February 21, 1856 when he was mustered out at Fort Meade. He rejoined and served again under Capt. Hooker from February 21, 1856 till August 20, 1856.


He was mustered in to service as a Private in Capt. Lesley's Independant Company of Florida Mounted Volunteers on August 20, 1856 at Fort Meade and was mustered out at Fort Brooke on July 19, 1857.

His final service in the Indian Wars was from March 11, 1858 to May 10, 1858 as a Private in Capt. Durrance's Independant Company of Florida Mounted Volunteers.

Daniel's two oldest sons, Alford and Owen, served with him during the Seminole War of 1856 in William B. Hooker's Company.

In 1860, Daniel Sloan was residing in Hillsborough County next door to his son, Owen Sloan, and his wife. Owen's occupation was given as a cattle driver.

When the Civil War broke out, Daniel became a member of the Confederate States Army. He served as a First Lieutenant in Company "B", First Battalion, Florida Special Cavalry commanded by Major Charles J. Munnerlyn (known as Munnerlyn's Battalion). This outfit consisted of men exempted from regular service, details for the cattle drives, employees of the Commissary Department and other loyal settlers, who could be persuaded to be drawn into the Confederate service but were allowed to remain in their communities where they could keep a careful and watchful eye on their families and property, according to "Lake Okeechobee" written by Kathryn Hanna. Two of Daniel's sons, Elbert and Orvil Sloan served in Company B, ("South Florida Infantry") 7th Florida Infantry of the Confederate States Army.

Mrs. Nancy Sloan was baptized by Rev. James M. Hayman, Baptist minister at Bethel (Socrum Settlement) in Polk County on September 7, 1864 along with her daughters, Catherine and Wealthy Ann Sloan.

Daniel Sloan and several of his married sons later moved to Sumter County, Florida. The 1880 Sumter County Census shows Gibson Sloan & his family living with Daniel & Nancy Sloan and two of the unmarried sons, John and William Sloan. Living nearby are the families of Alfred Sloan, Elbert Sloan and Owen Sloan.

Daniel also served his community as a Baptist minister. According to the records of Stetson University Library at Deland, Florida, his last pastorate was at Webster, Florida.

An article about early Sumter County pioneers says, "Old man Daniel Sloan lived near the spot where the widow Sallie Brown lives. He was a hardshell (Primitive Baptist) preacher here before the Civil War, and one of the most noted men that ever lived. He was one of the best farmers in the county. He raised such good corn that it would shell out a bushel and a quarter to the barrel. It was known far and wide as the Sloan corn."

Daniel died in 1888 and his wife died there in 1895. Both are buried in Dukes Cemetery at Groveland, Florida.

On July 31, 1965, a ceremony organized by Daniel's great-granddaughter, Miss Varnie Sloan of Tampa, Florida, was held at Dukes Cemetery to dedicate a military headstone to this Confederate Veteran.

#### EARLY HISTORY OF MT. EPHRAIM BAPTIST CHURCH

This history of the Baptist Church in Owens, Florida (De Soto County) was contributed by the Mt. Ephraim Baptist Church in memory of the early members of the Church. It was taken from the record book of the Church when it was organized on Aug. 9, 1884.

August 9, 1884: "Then while the congregation sang a beautiful and appropriate hymn, the following persons came forward and requested that their names be enrolled in order that they might take part in organizing the church, to wit:

Then O. H. Dishong was unanimously elected Church Clerk and O. S. Harris, Church Treasurer. It was then resolved that the minutes be read and adopted at the close of each conference. It was decided that the organization be called and known as the Mount Ephraim Church and be located at the Hayman School House. Elder J. H. Hayman was then called to the Pastoral care of the Church for the remainder of the current associational year.

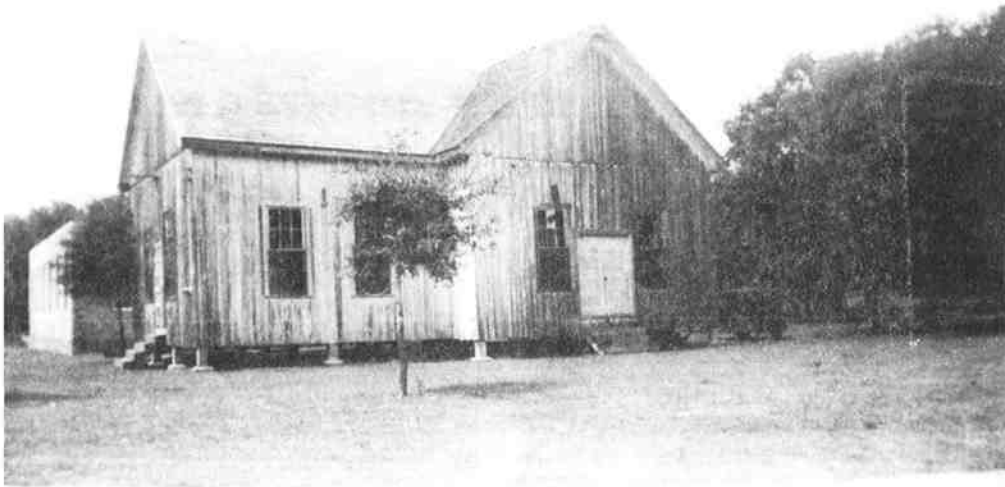
April 11, 1885: "The building of the church was freely conversed upon and the following committee was appointed to be known as the Building Committee: O. H. Dishong, O. S. Harris, W. C. Hayman, M. F. Lanier, Wiles Hanchey, Henry Langford, whose duty shall be to draft the plan of the house, make out the bill of lumber and at all times receive subscriptions. Forwarding the work to it each contribution."

May 1, 1886: "W. C. Hayman and wife, Sallie Hayman, deeded three (3) acres of land more or less in the County of Manatee, Florida, Described as a tract or parcel of land, to wit: A part of the S.E. quarter of the S.E. quarter, Section 8, Township 38, Range 24, to the Deacons and their successors of the Mount Ephraim Baptist Church. Deed recorded on the 25th day of August A.D., 1886, Book G, page 400 at Manatee Co., Fla.

William Cunningham Hayman, who gave the land for the Mt. Ephraim Baptist Church was a son of James and Delilah Hayman. The renowned Jeremiah Madison Hayman, pioneer Baptist preacher who laid the foundations of many of the strong Baptist churches of south Florida, was William's older brother. William was also a Baptist preacher and served as such at the Mt. Ephraim Church.

William married Mrs. Sarah "Sallie" Carlton Hooker in Polk County on December 14, 1865. She was the daughter of Alderman Carlton and his wife, Martha Maria Alderman and widow of Stephen P. Hooker. William's brother, Jeremiah M. Hayman, married Sarah's sister, Martha Jane Carlton.

ENOCH EVERETT MIZELL 1806-1887

"South Florida Pioneers" is indebted to a great-granddaughter of Enoch E. Mizell, Mrs. Annie P. Newton, 1014 W. Hickory St., Arcadia, Florida 33821, for most of the family data used in this sketch. Material was taken from her own research and from various printed sources.

Enoch Everett Mizell was born in Camden County, Georgia on April 6, 1806, son of David Mizell and his first wife, Sarah (maiden name unknown). Enoch was a grandson of Charlton Mizell, Sr. and Elizabeth Everett. He spent most of his younger days in Camden and Bulloch Counties, Georgia - later moving with his father to north Florida, near Alligator (Lake City), in Columbia County.

Enoch played a very active part in the Indian wars. His first service was as a Private under Capt. Roberts in 1835 or 1836. He served as a Private for two enlistments in Warren's Florida Mounted Militia in 1836 & 1837. He was Captain of his own company of the 2nd Regiment of East Florida Mounted Volunteers under Col. William J. Mills. He joined on June 16, 1837 at Fort White, located about 20 miles southwest of Alligator. It was during this campaign at Fort Mellon, near Sanford, Florida, on or about the 6th of December 1837, Enoch Mizell was thrown from his horse against a tree and was severely ruptured. He was treated by the Regiment Surgeon but this incident was to cause

Enoch pain for the rest of his life. On an application for an invalid pension in 1874, he stated, "I was thrown from my horse and terribly injured and disabled, having my thigh badly mashed and my body seriously injured from which a permanent rupture was caused which has become so violent as to destroy my physical health and renders me unable to perform manual labor for which I am dependent on for a support, I being a planter. The injury has been progressing from 1838 until the present time." He was mustered out with the Company on December 18, 1837 at Newmansville, Florida.

He served under Col. Robert Brown's Regiment of Florida Volunteers for a brief three month period from April 6, 1838 to July 22, 1838.

On August 22, 1840 at Fort Call, East Florida, Enoch E. Mizell once again mustered another Company of his own. This

one was in the 1st Regiment of W. J. Bailey's Florida Mounted Militia. Enoch's half-brother, Morgan Mizell, was a Private in this Company. They were mustered out at Lancaster, East Florida on November 29, 1840.

Enoch E. Mizell could not be located in the 1840 Florida census. His father, David Mizell, Sr. and his half-brother, David Mizell, Jr. were living in Columbia County, Florida. Enoch may have been living at home with his father or was deep in the Florida swamps fighting Indians, out of reach of most sensible census takers.

It seems that most of Enoch's time in his younger days was spent fighting Indians and defending the lands of his adopted State so that he had little time for finding a wife. In 1846, at the age of 40, Enoch married Miss Minerva Ann Parrish on November 4th in Alachua County, Florida. David Gillet, Justice of the Peace for the 2nd District of Alachua County performed the service. Enoch's father had moved to Alachua County from Columbia County several years before.

Minerva was born in Camden County, Georgia in 1815, daughter of Ezekiel Parrish (born 1779) and Elizabeth Crawford (born 1781). Minerva was the granddaughter of a Revolutionary Soldier, Henry Parrish, born about 1740 in Virginia, and his wife, Mary Ann Monk. Minerva's brother, Crawford Parrish, was also an early settler of south Florida. The town of Parrish in Manatee County was named after him and his family.

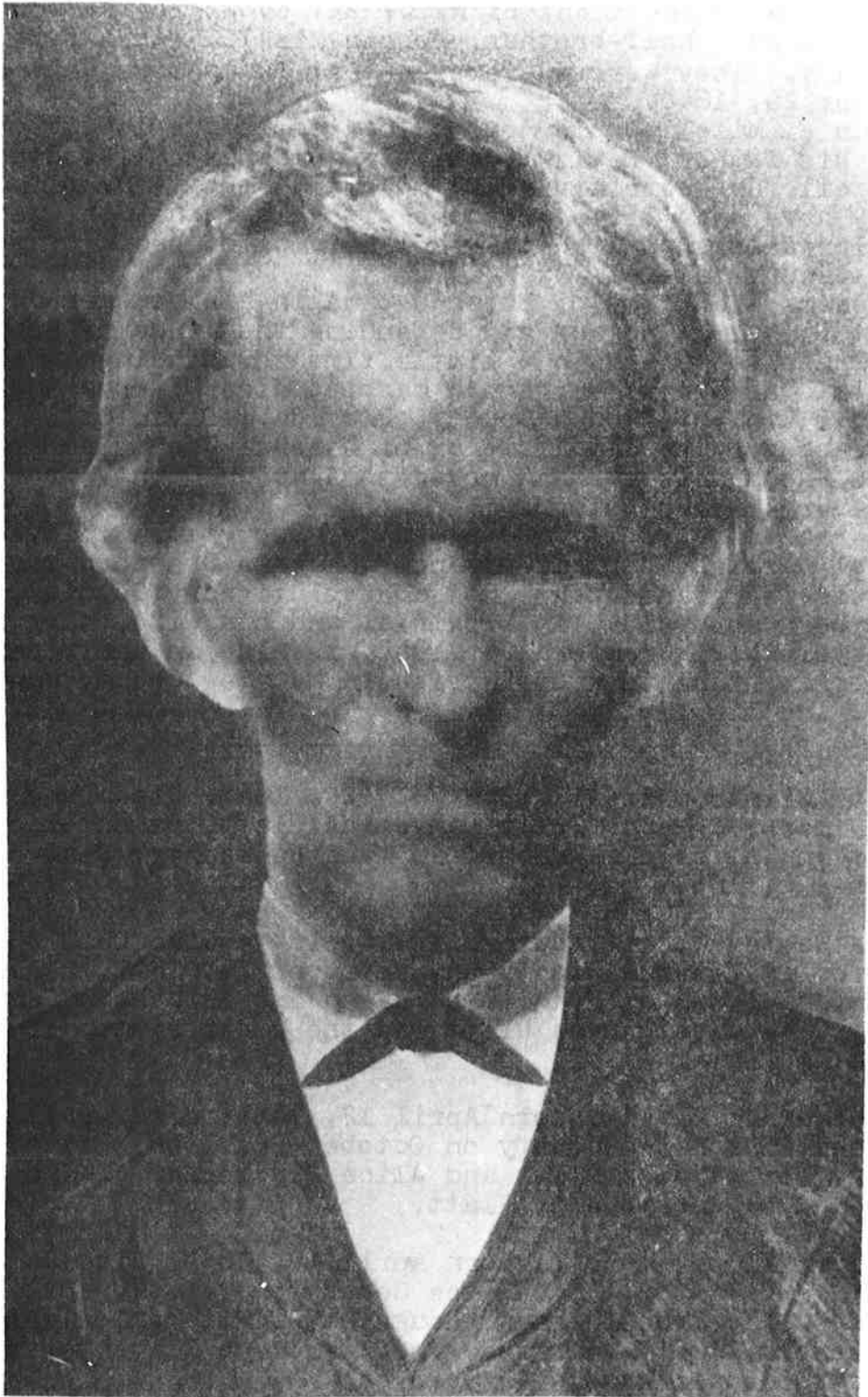
Enoch Everett Mizell and Minerva Parrish had four children:

1. George Clinton Mizell, born July 20, 1847; died June 25, 1895; married Mary "Polly" Angeline Platt, daughter of John Platt and Alice Blackshear, in Manatee County, Fla. on October 1, 1868.
2. David Wesley Mizell, born July 14, 1849; died Dec. 23, 1924; married in Manatee County on September 14, 1877, Rowena Hagan, daughter of Francis B. Hagan and Elizabeth Jane Platt. Elizabeth Jane Platt was the older sister of Mary Angeline Platt.
3. Annie Amanda Mizell, born April 12, 1851; died April 7, 1933; married in Manatee County on October 22, 1868, Francis Marion Platt, son of John Platt and Alice Blackshear, and brother of Mary and Elizabeth Jane Platt.
4. Millard Filmore Mizell, born April 18, 1853; died Jan. 12, 1936; married 1st, in Manatee County on Jan. 4, 1883, Miss Clifford Lavonia Alderman, daughter of Mitchell Alderman and Lenora O'Neil; married, 2nd, Caroline Clements; married 3rd, Mrs. Bunia Whatley Powers.

Enoch and his family lived in Alachua County for about three or four years. He was a Justice of the Peace from 1845 to 1849 in that area as his name appears quite frequently in Alachua's marriage records as the individual performing the ceremonies.

On July 22, 1849 at Fort Dade, Enoch organized another company of soldiers which was known as Capt. Mizell's Independent Company. Morgan Mizell was a Third Lieutenant in this Company. This group was mustered out of service on Oct. 23, 1849.

The Mizells later moved down into Benton County (now Hernando County), Florida. He was a Justice of the Peace there

from 1849 to 1851 and later from 1859 to 1861. In the 1850 Benton County Census taken on November 20, 1850, Enoch E. Mizell, wife Minerva and two sons were listed as living at Buddy's Lake Settlement along with the families of James M. Bates, Nathaniel M. Moody and wife, Cornelia Mizell (Enoch's sister), brother, Joshua Mizell and his half-brother, Morgan Mizell.

Benton County was changed to Hernando County in 1850. In 1852, in that county, Enoch received a Bounty Land Warrent (#13881) for 160 acres of land, for his services in the Indian Wars.

Enoch's first wife, Minerva, died about 1855 and was buried near Lake Hancock, northwest of Dade City on the present day county line between Hernando and Pasco Counties but was all included in Hernando County at that time.

It wasn't long before Enoch married again. The hostile environment of pioneer Florida demanded the full attention of a man to protect himself, his property and his family. An added burden of four young children to care for and worry about was too much for a man alone. He needed a woman to assist him in the proper caring and training of these youngsters.

Enoch married Miss Annie Jackson about 1857, probably in Hernando County (the early marriage records of Hernando County have been destroyed). She was born about 1841, and was 35 years younger than her husband. Her sister, Elizabeth Jackson, married John M. Bates of Hernando County about the same time. The Bates moved down into Manatee County prior to 1860.

Children of Enoch and Annie Jackson Mizell:

5. Martha E. Mizell, born May 15, 1858; died Dec. 7, 1945; married in Manatee County on May 22, 1877 Andrew Green, son of James Green and Eliza Whidden.
6. Joshua Mizell, born 1860; died 1941; married Mrs. Eugenia Hatch.
7. Joseph Mizell, born May 22, 1862; died May 15, 1937; married Fannie Arnold.
8. Nancy Mizell, born 1864; died June 25, 1953; married 1st, Zachary Taylor Crawford; married 2nd, on July 15, 1891, D. Thomas Carlton, son of McKeen Ward Carlton and Anna Morrison.
9. Mary Mizell, born Dec. 27, 1865; died 1936; married in DeSoto County on Feb. 9, 1888 John Burdett Sellers.
10. Fannie Mizell, born Oct. 25, 1868; died Dec. 20, 1871.
11. Estelena Mizell, born March 10, 1872; died 1963; married in DeSoto County on April 15, 1891, John Hagan, son of Francis B. Hagan and Elizabeth Jane Platt
12. Missouri Mizell, born July 21, 1875; died 1966; married on April 5, 1896, Thaddeus S. Carlton, son of McKeen Ward Carlton and Anna Morrison.

There was also an unnamed daughter who only lived three weeks according to the reverse side of the tombstone of Enoch E. Mizell.

Sometime during the Civil War, probably about 1862, Enoch pulled up his stakes in Hernando County, gathered his moveable property together, loaded his family & supplies into a wagon and moved down into Manatee County in the vicinity of Pine Level. This was several years before Pine Level gained its importance as the county seat. It is not known why Enoch & his family left Hernando County for a new frontier. It may have been that disputes and conflicts caused by the Civil War & intensified by Union sympathizers and slave owners in Hernando County induced the Mizells to seek a quieter residence in a peaceful, less populated area. The Bates and Platt families (both had moved to Manatee County earlier from Hernando County) may have written to the Mizells telling them of the great areas of rich land for farming and raising cattle.

Enoch E. Mizell was prevented from serving in the military during the Civil War because of his age and his injuries from the Indian Wars. The Enoch E. Mizell which served in Company B, 7th Florida Infantry of the Confederate forces was probably the son of Joseph Mizell who had settled in Hillsborough County.

In 1866, Pine Level was chosen as the new county seat of Manatee County. Enoch Mizell was a familiar figure around the new courthouse. He served as County Judge from 1866 to 1867 and was listed as such in the 1870 Census. He also served as a Justice of the Peace from 1866 to 1875. Many a couple in Pine Level and the surrounding areas were united in matrimony by Mr. Mizell.

Thirteen families were living in Township 37 of Manatee County in 1870 - one of which was Enoch Mizell whose occupation was given as Judge of County Court. Others living in this area were his oldest son, George Mizell, Benjamin Sloan, John F. Bartloff (Clerk of the Circuit Court), James A. Jones, Dennis Driggers, Andrew W. Garner (Sheriff), George W. Albritton & his wife Lenora Garner, Wells Hancey, Oliver Walker, Joshua Platt, George Walker and John M. Bates.

In 1874, Enoch applied for an Old War Invalid pension, based on his war service in his younger years. On his application, he gave his description as 5 feet 8 inches, fair complexion, light hair and blue eyes. His half-brother, Morgan Mizell, testified on his behalf but Enoch's application was rejected. The Pension Department stated that he could not furnish the evidence required, even though he had been granted land in Hernando County for his prior service, years before.

In 1880, Enoch & family were living in Precinct #1 of Manatee County. Some of his neighbors were A. W. Garner, Lewis Daniels, Dan E. Graham, Jesse Alderman, F. B. Hagan, Jeff Daniels, James D. Green and Andrew Green.

Enoch Everett Mizell died on September 22, 1887 and was buried in the Campground Cemetery at Pine Level, Florida. He did not have a will. On April 6, 1888 County Judge O. T. Stanford appointed his sons, Joseph and Joshua Mizell to be administrators of his estate. John W. Jackson and H. H. Norris were appointed appraisers of the estate and presented the following schedule of personal property to the County Judge: 1,800 stock cattle, 5 horses, 1½ yoke of oxen, 100 pounds of unwashed wool, one 30 gal. sugar kettle, one wagon, one plow, one organ, one clock, 2 sewing machines, one parlor stove, 7 bedsteads, 13 dining room chairs, 1 center table, 1 dining table,



one sofa, one wash stand, 1 bookcase, 1 bureau, one wardrobe, 2 feather beds, 12 mattresses, 25 bed quilts, 12 pillow cases, and assorted dining room and kitchen furniture and fixtures.

Also among the estate papers of Enoch E. Mizell are listed the names of individuals who held notes and accounts with Enoch. A listing of these people is given in hopes that it might help someone pin point the where abouts of someone in their family during this time: Thomas L. Bates, Nathan C. Platt, J. A. Albritton, G. C. Mizell, J. B. Willis, O. F. Whidden, Mathew Mizell, E. G. Harris, Milledge Posey, F. H. Hall, M. T. Howell, Thomas Lucas, S. T. Langford, A. T. Walker, P. O. Keen, William Alderman, Andrew Green, H. J. Pritchett, D. J. Farabee, Henry Futch, John Driggers, Desdemony Driggers, Mrs. C. J. Harris, Herod Keen, Floyd Hall, Isham Simmons, Alex Rimer, James H. Graham, R. B. Albritton, E. B. Carlton, A. J. Keen, William Willis, Charles Bidley, W. C. Hayman, Bas Whidden, Noah Whidden, Joe Messer, Wm. M. Albritton, Wm. A. Durrance, Dan Graham, Florida Green, D. S. Pate, Peden Barnhill, Mrs. N. J. High, William F. Handcock, Dan Whidden, David Mizell, Henry Locklier, E. Barnhill, H. H. Norris and M. B. Mizell.

Joseph Mizell was appointed guardian of Estelena and Missouri Mizell, minor heirs of E. E. Mizell.

Annie Jackson Mizell died in February of 1888 and was buried along side her husband at Campground Cemetery.

#### FAMILY BIBLE OF LEVI PEARCE

This Bible belonged to Rev. Levi Pearce who was a circuit riding Methodist Preacher in early Hillsborough County. He lived at Alafia and served as a Corporal in the Florida Mounted Volunteers during the Indian Wars. He enrolled Feb. 17, 1857 and was discharged on August 7, 1859 at Fort Brooke, Florida. The cover of the Bible was lost in a fire and was partly burned but the part with the family records was saved. It is in the possession of Mrs. Annie Pearce, daughter-in-law of Rev. Pearce. She was born Aug. 26, 1887 and married Levi's youngest son, Charles W. Pearce.

Mrs. Pearce, who lives at Owens, Florida in DeSoto County, contributed the preceding introductory material and the information in the Bible. Bible was printed in 1853 by Phinney and Co. of Buffalo.

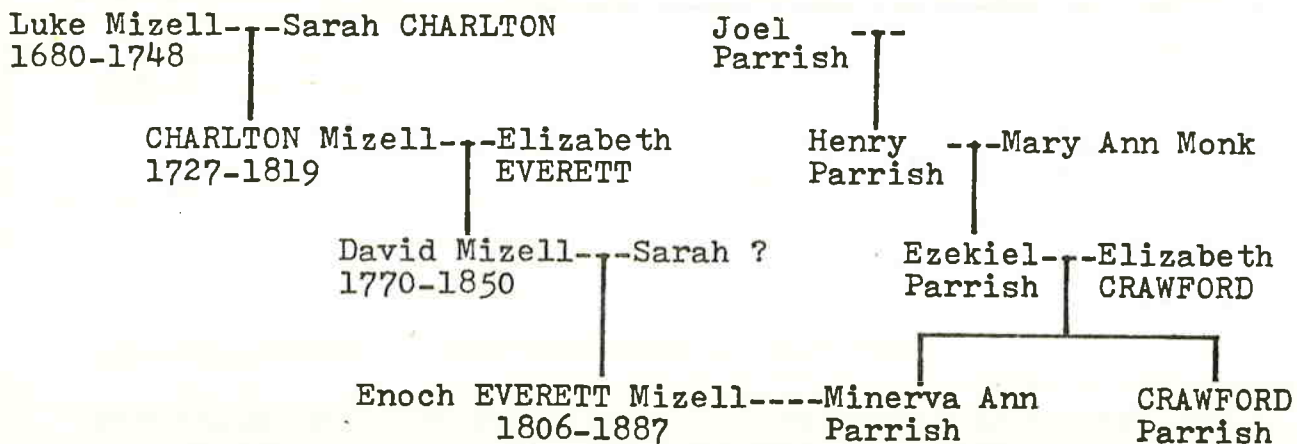
