

MR. BENJAMIN F. BEEKMAN'S WILL.

The will of Mr. Benjamin F. Beekman, whose recent death called forth resolutions of regret from so many public bodies, was admitted to probate yesterday by Surrogate Hutchings. Mr. Beekman leaves \$4,500 for the erection of a monument to his memory on his plot in Green-Wood, and directs the investment of \$500, the interest to be perpetually devoted to keeping the plot in order. The income of \$100,000 is devoted to the use of his widow, Catherine Adelaide, and the interest of \$10,000 to his mother, Elizabeth. The remainder of the estate, valued at about \$200,000, is distributed among his other relations. His widow is made executrix, and Messrs. J. Reed Van Derveer and William C. Larned executors of the will.
