

SHE WAS HIS FAITHFUL NURSE.

The wedding of Dr. H. S. Houghton, house surgeon at Bellevue Hospital, and Miss Sadie C. Preston, daughter of W. R. Preston, of the Broad-street firm of W. R. Preston & Co., was to take place to-day. It has been postponed, however. Several weeks ago Dr. Houghton, then just back from his vacation, was stricken with typhoid fever. He was taken to Mr. Preston's country residence at Irvington-on-the-Hudson, and for some time there were grave fears that he would not recover. Miss Preston acted as a faithful nurse, and devoted her time almost entirely to the patient. It is said that to her nursing Dr. Houghton owes in great part his recovery. While he is now convalescent, he is not yet able to leave his bed, and it will be some time before the wedding can take place. The doctor will probably go abroad as soon as possible.
