## EDWARD HOUGHTON JANES, M. D.

Dr. Edward Houghton Janes, Assistant Sanitary Superintendent of the Board of Health, died at his home, 57 West Ninety-fifth Street, early yesterday morning of heart failure following an attack of the grip. He was at the meeting of the Board of Health last Wednesday and was in good health except for a slight cold.

Dr. Janes was born in 1820 and was graduated at Berkshire Medical Institute in 1847. He was appointed Assistant Sanitary Superintendent of the Board of Health in 1866, succeeding Dr. Dalton, and held the office to the time of his death, except during the incumbency of Dr. Elisha Harris. In 1860 he married Miss Jane M. Yates. They had three children, Miss Martha Janes and Edward F. and Elisha Harris Janes.

Dr. Janes was a musician of considerable attainments. He was at one time Vice President of the American Public Health Association, and was one of the best known sanitarians in the country.

The funeral services will be held at the residence to-morrow afternoon at 2 o'clock.
