A BATCH OF NEW DOCTORS.

ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE GRADU-

ATES RECEIVE THEIR DIPLOMAS. Steinway Hall was crowded yesterday afternoon with an audience of over 1,500 people at the seventy-fifth annual Commencement of the College of Physicians and Surgeons, the Medical Department of Columbia College. Among the physicians present on the platform were President Alonzo Clark, M. D.: Registrar Ellsworth Eliot, M. D.; Drs. Jared Linsly, Samuel T. Hubbard, Thomas F. Cock, Cornelius R. Agnew, Thomas M. Markoe, William H. Draper, John C. Dalton, John G. Curtis, Abraham Jacobs, and Fessenden N. Otis. The ceremonies were opened with prayer, and Dr. Clark, the President of the college, conferred the degrees upon the 125 graduates who were seated in front of the platform. The President delivered an address, in which he reviewed the discoveries wh誰h had been made in the practice of medicine and the great progress of medical science. Prof. William H. Draper, M. D., President of the Alumni Association, and Prof. John G. Curtis, M. D., Secretary of the Faculty, made brief addresses, announcing the awards of the prizes. The first of the three annual Harsen prizes for clinical reports, \$150, was awarded to Charles Henry May, of New-York; the second, \$75, to Abram Brothers, B. S., of New-York, and the third, \$25, to P. D. St. John, B. S., of Iowa. The Harsen prizes for profisiency at examination were awarded as follows: First prize, \$500, to Charles Henry May, of New-York; second prize, \$300, to Jacob H. Frankenberg, of New-York, and the third prize. \$200, to Albert F. Brugman, of New-York. The remaining Harsen prizes of \$25 each went to the seven others who received diplomas of "examination honors." These were A. W. Hurd, A. B., Illinois; G. F. Roberts, New-Hampshire; Richmond Lennox, New-York; J. E. Newcomb, A. B., Connecticut; H. S. Quin, New-York; F. L. Sevenoak, A. M., New-York, and H. P. Cooper, Georgia. After the 10 diplomas of examination honors were awarded the Alamai examination honors were awarded the Alumni Association prize of \$500 was given to Walter Mendelsohn, a graduate of the Class of '79. The ceremonies concluded with an address by the Rev. Noah Porter, D. D., President of Yale College. He said that it had been feared that modern materialistic theories would sadly affect the religious belief of the medical profession, but physicians in this country and in England had less sicians in this country and in England had less materialistic tendency than they had three genera-tions ago. The theory of evolution seemed rather to have enlarged and deepened the mystery which surrounds the laws of life and opened up a way for more exalted thought. The four graduates who stood first upon the honor list have the privilege of accepting positions upon the medical staff of Bellevue Hospital. William H. May resigned this privilege, and his place was accepted by Jacob
