MEMORIAL AT GREENWICH.

Window in St. Paul's Church Is to be Unveiled on Saturday.

GREENWICH, Conn., Nov. 23.—A very handsome memorial window costing about \$1,000 is to be unveiled at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Riverside, Saturday morning by the rector, the Rev. C. W. Boylston, assisted by other clergy.

The window is by Mayer & Co. of Munich, Bavaria, and of New York, and is about five feet wide and ten feet in height.

The Rev. Dr. G. C. Houghton of New York and Luke A. Lockwood, a lawyer of Riverside and New York, are the givers. Life-long friends have thus combined their memorial gift, the latter in memory of his daughter, Mrs. Gertrude Louise Baldwin, the wife of Dr. William Baldwin of New Haven, and of Miss Gilmore, a friend of his family.

Dr. Houghton's part in the memorial window is in honor of his wife, Mary, who died a year ago. He will be present at the unveiling.

Chicago Society Musicale.

The Chicago Society of New York gave a musicale, followed by refreshments, in the Astor Gallery of the Waldorf-Astoria last night. The musicale consisted of the cantata of "Hiawatha" and several instrumental and vocal numbers by the quartet and chorus of the South Church, under the direction of Prof. Gerrit Smith.
