Plans have been completed for the marriage of Miss Gratia Buell Houghton, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Amory Houghton of Washington, D. C., and Corning, N. The ceremony will take place on Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock in St. Aidan's Chapel on the Houghton Summer estate, The Meadows, at South Dartmouth, Mass., and will be followed by a wedding breakfast.
