

MAJOR HAUGHTON IS BACK.

Former President of Braves Probably Through with Baseball.

Major Percy D. Haughton, former President of the Boston Braves, and former football coach at Harvard, returned from France yesterday on the Baltic. Major Haughton has been in France since last August, and was attached to headquarters of the 26th Division.

When Major Haughton learned that John Heydler had been elected President of the National League, he said: "I want to congratulate the National League owners on their choice. It was a wise one, and I am certainly delighted to receive this splendid news. It means a lot for baseball."

Major Haughton said that one of the chief topics of discussion abroad was the way the United States had stood behind her men in the service.

The former President of the Boston Club resigned his position when he entered the service, and it is not expected that he will return to professional baseball. It is very likely, however, that Haughton will be found at the head of Harvard's football activities when the pigskin starts rolling next Fall.
