## MISS BABST BETROTHED

**New York Debutante of Last Season  
to Marry George H. Parsons—

Ex-State Senator and Mrs. William J. Tully of 610 Park Avenue and Locust Valley, L. I., have announced the engagement of their youngest daughter, Miss Marion Gordon Tully, to Reeve Hoover of Washington, D. C., son of William D. Hoover, President of the National Savings and Trust Company.

Miss Tully was graduated from Westover in 1921, and afterward studied in Paris for two years. She was presented in the Diplomatic Circle at the Court of St. James's last May with her sister, Miss Alice Bigelow Tully by her uncle, Ambassador Houghton. Her father served in the State Senate representing the district including Corning, N. Y., which was formerly the family residence, and where for a long number of years her paternal and maternal grandfathers, the late Joseph J. Tully and Amory Houghton, were associated in the management of the Corning Glass Works. Senator Tully is the general solicitor of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company.

Mr. Hoover was graduated from Hill School and from Yale in the class of 1921. During the war he served in the field artillery. He is a member of the real estate firm of Hoover & Davidson in Washington. He has one sister, who married Fairfax Stuart Landstreet Jr. of New York and who now resides with her husband in Huntington, W. Va.

**Friends of the Movement to Hold
