WASHINGTON, Aug. 22.

The marriage of Miss Sherrill Jean Mulliken, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Otis E. Mulliken, to Arthur Amory Houghton 3d of New York took place here this afternoon. The bridegroom is the son of Mr. Houghton, Jr., of New York and Wye Plantation, Queenstown, Md., and the late Mrs. Ellen Crenshaw Houghton.

Canon William G. Workman performed the ceremony in the Great Choir of the Protestant Episcopal Cathedral of St. Peter and St. Paul. A reception was held at the City Tavern Club.

Mr. Mulliken gave his daughter in marriage. She wore a gown of mousseline de soie over ivory taffeta made with a full train and a mantilla of princess lace. She carried a bouquet of lilies of the valley, white roses and cypripedium.

Mrs. Hubert René Halkin was her sister's matron of honor. The other attendants were Mrs. Antonio Olivieri and the Misses Kazuko Matsumura, Judith McGregor and Hollister Houghton, sister of the bridegroom. They all wore full-length gowns of willow green linen and matching velvet bows on their heads. Their bouquets were of white roses with dark ivy.
